Veteran Rights Told To Aid Information

Veterans attending school or learning a trade or profession under the G. I. Bill may now receive the advantages of experienced vocational and educational guidance, John W. Joerger, Veterans Administration representative in this area, has announced.

The services of the guidance section has been devoted largely up to now to advising disabled veterans, since the procedure is a requirement of the law for these men before they may take advantage of educational or training benefits. However, the law provides that VA guidance facilities shall be available to all veterans, and with the bulk of the "urgent" cases out of the way, personnel and facilities are now available for all veterans wishing to take advantage of them, Joerger said.

Q. I receive a disability pension. Is my pension subject to change if I take a position?

A. No. Disabled veterans are encouraged to do such work as their disability permits. This does not effect the amount of their pensions because they are based on the veteran's disability as determined by the Veterans Administration rating schedule. Such pensions are subject to change only as the disability itself changes.

Q. Can I get a guaranteed loan to pay off a debt that is past due? A. Yes, under certain conditions. Full information may be secured from the lender or from a VA loan guarantee officer.

Q. Why is it necessary to have the property appraised before I can get a guaranteed loan?

A. The law requires that the purchase price paid or to be paid for the property or the cost of construction, alterations and improvements, must not be more than the reasonable value thereof as determined by proper appraisal made by an appraiser designated by the VA. This provision and the appraisal it entails are requirements by Congress for the protection of the veteran.

Q. I received a bad conduct discharge. Am I eligible for any benefits under the Servicemen's Readjustment Act (The G. I. Bill)?

A. As you hold neither an honorable nor a dishonorable discharge.

charge from the armed services, it would be necessary for you to contact your nearest VA office for a decision as to whether you were discharged under conditions other than dishonorable—or you may apply to your branch of the service for a review of your discharge.

Q. I was disabled as a result of my World War II service in the Merchant Marine. Am I entitled to vocational rehabilitation?

A. Not from the Veterans Administration as you are not a veteran of the US military service. However, you may secure it from the Federal-State rehabilitation program under the Federal Security Administration.
