

**New and Final Information About Bob Christianson Sent**

Word from the War Department to Mr and Mrs Arthur Christianson is that their son, Robert Kelso Christianson, was on a B-24 that made a flight from Green Island to Truk, strongly fortified Japanese naval base, and that his plane was seen to explode north of Uman Island. Time of death has therefore been set as April 6, 1944. Previously the date of death was computed as February 1945. This information is new as to the flight and cause of death.
