Effective date of actual operation, says Mr Knighten, will be January 1, 1948 although directors will be elected in June and will do all other things except levy taxes until next year. Another law puts county school superintendents under the rural school board in counties whose entire area is under the rural school board. This law will go into effect July 5.
