Stock Show Plans Finished At Board Meeting

Final plans for the Eastern Oregon Wheat League Stock Show & Sale were made Tuesday when directors and committee chairman met to decide arrangements.

The premium list is out, giving not only the prizes offered but also the program which officially begins May 27, following the arrival of the stock at Wink's auction yard the previous evening. The first day will begin at 6 a. m. when hogs and sheep will be weighed, tagged and sifted. Including the cattle that job will be over in time for 7:30 breakfast.

Judging contests will start at nine, the showmanship contests will start after noon. The Dalles Chamber of Commerce and civic clubs will entertain the visitors Tuesday night with several events including plane and boat rides, a dinner and probably a show.

Judging of hogs and sheep will be concluded Tuesday afternoon and cattle will be judged Wednesday morning. The sale will begin at seven in the evening.

Edward Saxton of Helena, Montana, livestock photographer, will be on hand to take pictures of the stock and events.

Buyers have been informed of the sale and most of the companies that buy stock are expected to send representatives. Stock may be killed at The Dalles and prepared for shipment.

The entry lists are not complete but several hundred head of stock is expected for this first exhibit of strictly wheat fed cattle, sheep and hogs by 4-H club boys and girls of the wheat growing counties of Oregon. The show has been in the planning stage since December 1945 when the wheat league appointed its first group of committees to prepare for the event.

Fred Justesen Service Set For Sunday

Fred Justesen, resident of Sherman county since 1904, died Wednesday night in a hospital in The Dalles after a weeks illness.

Mr. Justesen was born in Denmark July 18, 1887 and came to America when he was 20 years old. In 1889 he was married to Thora Boesen in Omaha, Nebraska. They later came to Oregon moving to Sherman county in the first years of the century.

Surviving are his widow and four sons, Art and Harry, who operate the family wheat ranch east of Kent, Theodore of Maupin and Roy of Condon. He was a member of the Lutheran church and has been an Odd Fellow for 50 years.

Funeral services will be held Sunday afternoon at 2:30 p. m. from the Moro Community church and interment will be made in the Moro cemetery.

Roads Listed for Improvement If Special Levy Wins

The list of roads to be improved, together with the miles involved and the amount of gravel for each, has been made up by the court. Improvement of these roads is dependent on the passage of the special election to be held June 20 in Sherman county.

Instead of calling for a three year special tax in the county, the county court has reduced it to two years and is asking for \$40,000 per year, which, with the usual road fund money is considered sufficient to finish the work planned.
