Mr and Mrs G. Douma left for Bend and Prineville to spend the weekend fishing and visiting with relatives.

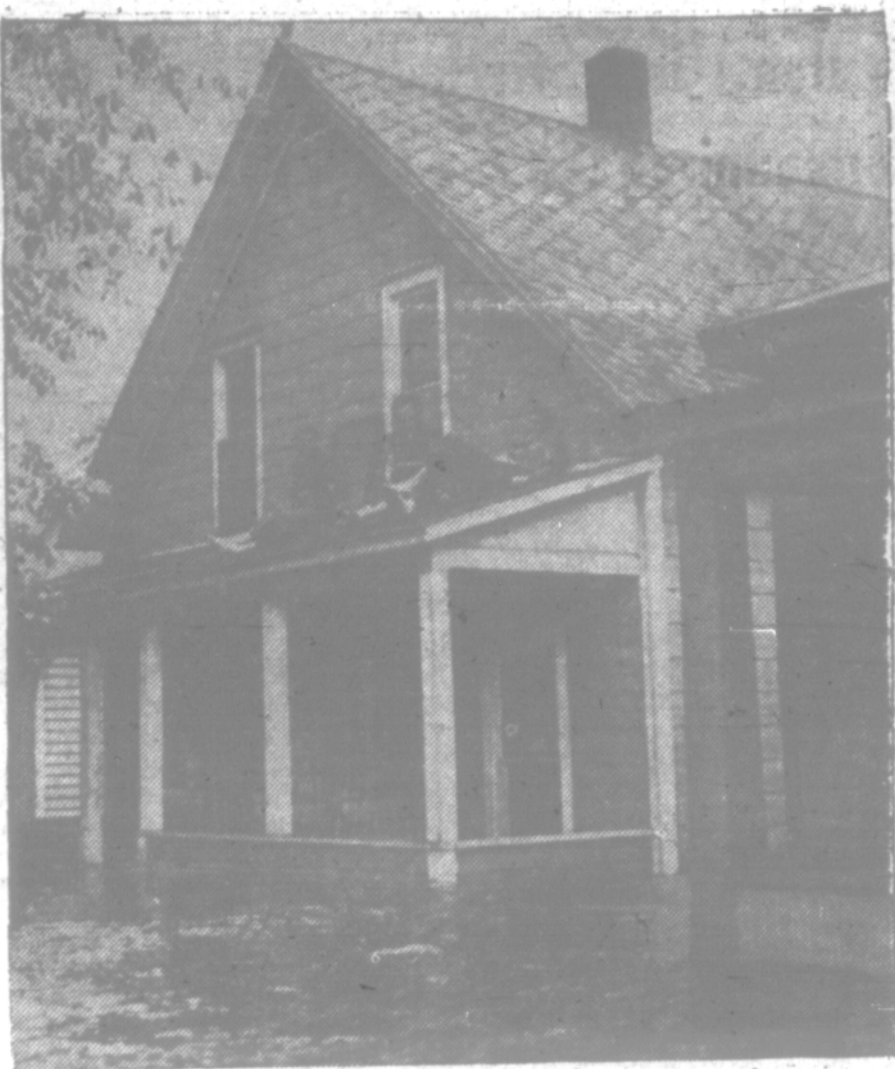
Mr and Mrs John Kirkelle from Logansport, Wn., were in Moro last weekend visiting Mr and Mrs Ivan Kirkelle and family.
