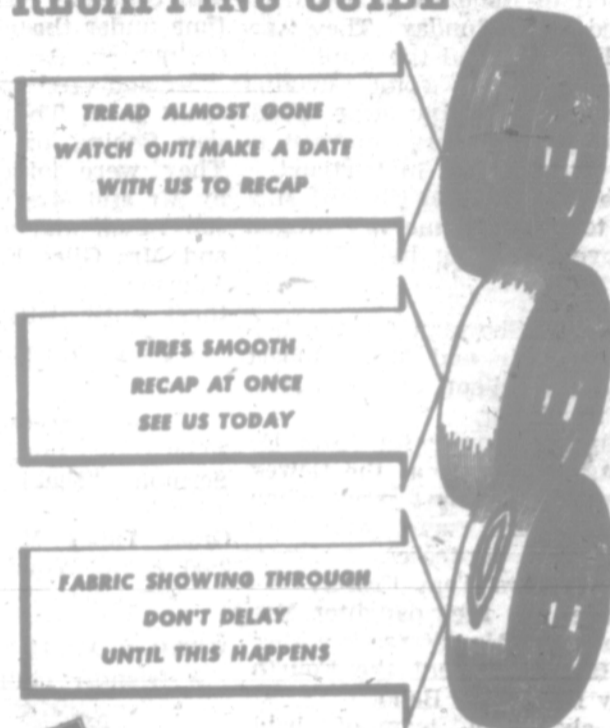

Important, Oregon Motorists! Driver's Licenses Numbered 5B-33,000 To 5B-66,000 Expire During July!

You must apply for renewal this month ONLY if your driver's license serial number is in the above group.

- No individual notice will be mailed to you.
- Do not apply by mail. Apply at the driver's license clerk or examiner in your community.
- No re-examination is required.

If your driver's license number is higher than 5B-66,000, get a renewal schedule from any service station, police or sheriff's office, or license clerk or examiner.

Oregon driver's licenses 5B-1 to 5B-33,000 are already invalid. Look at yours to make sure you are not violating the law.
