Mrs George Meloy came up from Corvallis to visit with Mrs. Charles Adlard.

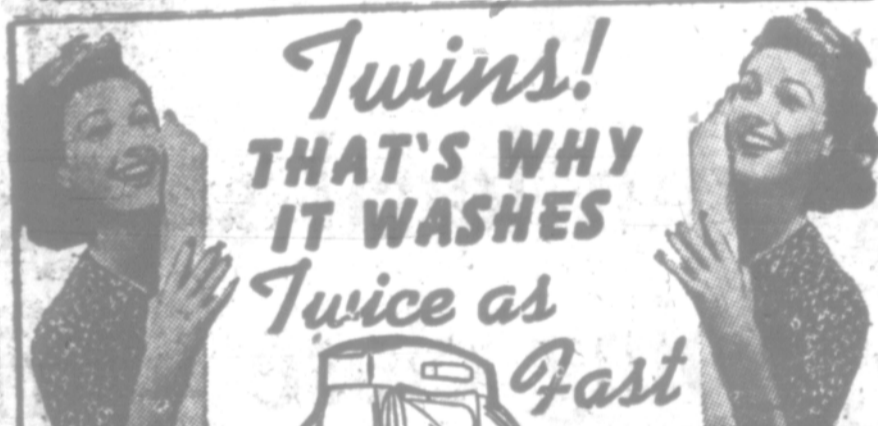

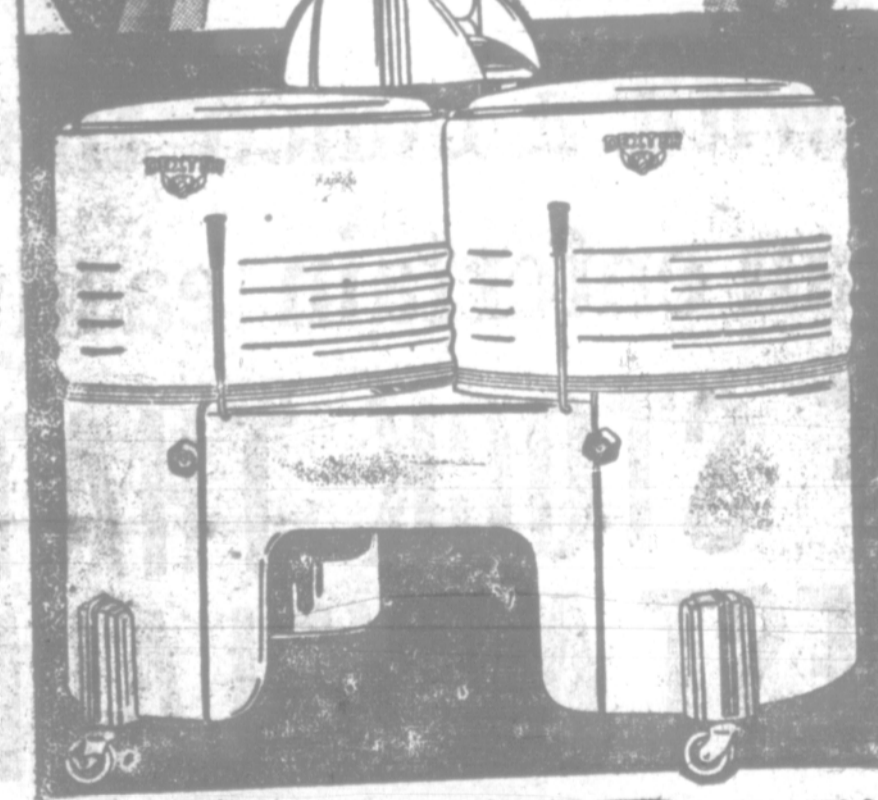
