which time prescribed in the
order for publication hereof, was
fixed as the 12th day of Septem-
ber 1947.

AND if you fail so to appear
and answer, plaintiffs for want
thereof will apply to the Court
for the relief prayed for in plain-
tiffs' Amended Complaint herein,
to wit:

For a decree of the above en-
titled Court construing the last
will and testament of JOHN D.
McDERMID, deceased, and ad-
judging what legates are en-
titled to distribution of the trust
fund derived from the sale of the
real property devised in trust by
the said will of JOHN D. McDER-
MID, deceased, and adjudging the
amount of the distributive share
to which each legatee is entitled;

For a decree adjudging that
the one-eighth (1/8) of the residue
of said trust fund bequeathed by
the will of JOHN D. McDermid
to his brother, ARCHIBALD Mc-
DERMID, became a part of and is
merged with the five-eighths
(5/8) of the residue of said trust
fund which is by said will be-
queathed to the surviving child-
ren of the testator's deceased
brother, MALCOLM McDermid,
(except for his son Robert), to
the surviving children of the test-
ator's deceased brother, DONALD
McDERMID (except his sons Don-
ald and John), to the surviving
grandchildren of the testator's
deceased sister, JANET McDER-
MID, to the surviving children
of the testator's deceased sister,
CHRISTINA WALKER, and to the
surviving children of the test-
ator's deceased sister, MAR-
GARET McDermid;

For a further decree adjudging
that said residuary five-eighths
(5/8) (including said lapsed one-
eighth (1/8) of ARCHIBALD Mc-
DERMID) is distributive only
among those children and grand-
children of the last named de-

ceased brothers and sisters of the
testator as were living at the
death of ELIZA J. DINGLE, wi-
dow of the testator;

And for a further decree ad-
judging that HUGH A. WALKER
and JEAN CURTIS, plaintiffs
herein, are each entitled to three
thirty seconds (3/32) of the entire
residuary trust estate remaining
after the payment of the specific
legacies payable therefrom and
after the payment of the costs
of administration of said trust
and the costs of this suit charged
against said trust fund by the
decree herein.

And for a further decree allow-
ing and awarding to the plain-
tiffs herein their costs and dis-
bursements in this suit together
with reasonable attorneys' fees to
be paid from said trust fund
before distribution thereof;

And for a decree directing the
defendant, LESTER BARNUM,
trustee of said trust fund, to pay
therefrom the said expenses,
costs and attorneys' fees and to
distribute the remainder of said
trust fund to the persons and in
the proportions adjudged, enti-
tled thereto by the Court; and for
such other and further relief as
the Court may deem meet and
equitable in the premises.

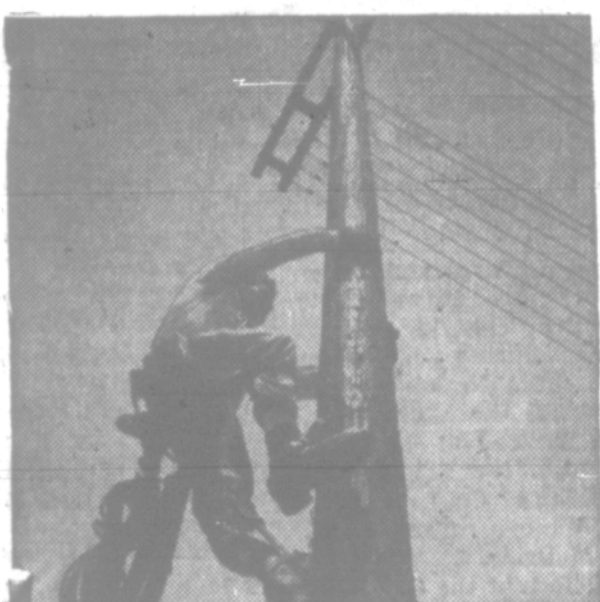

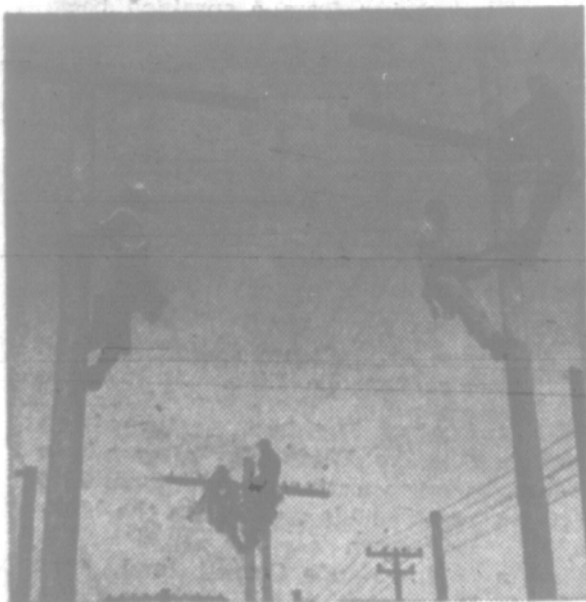
