The Ladies Social club met at the home of Mrs T. M. Rolfe Thursday afternoon with nine members present. After the regular meeting refreshments were served by the hostess.

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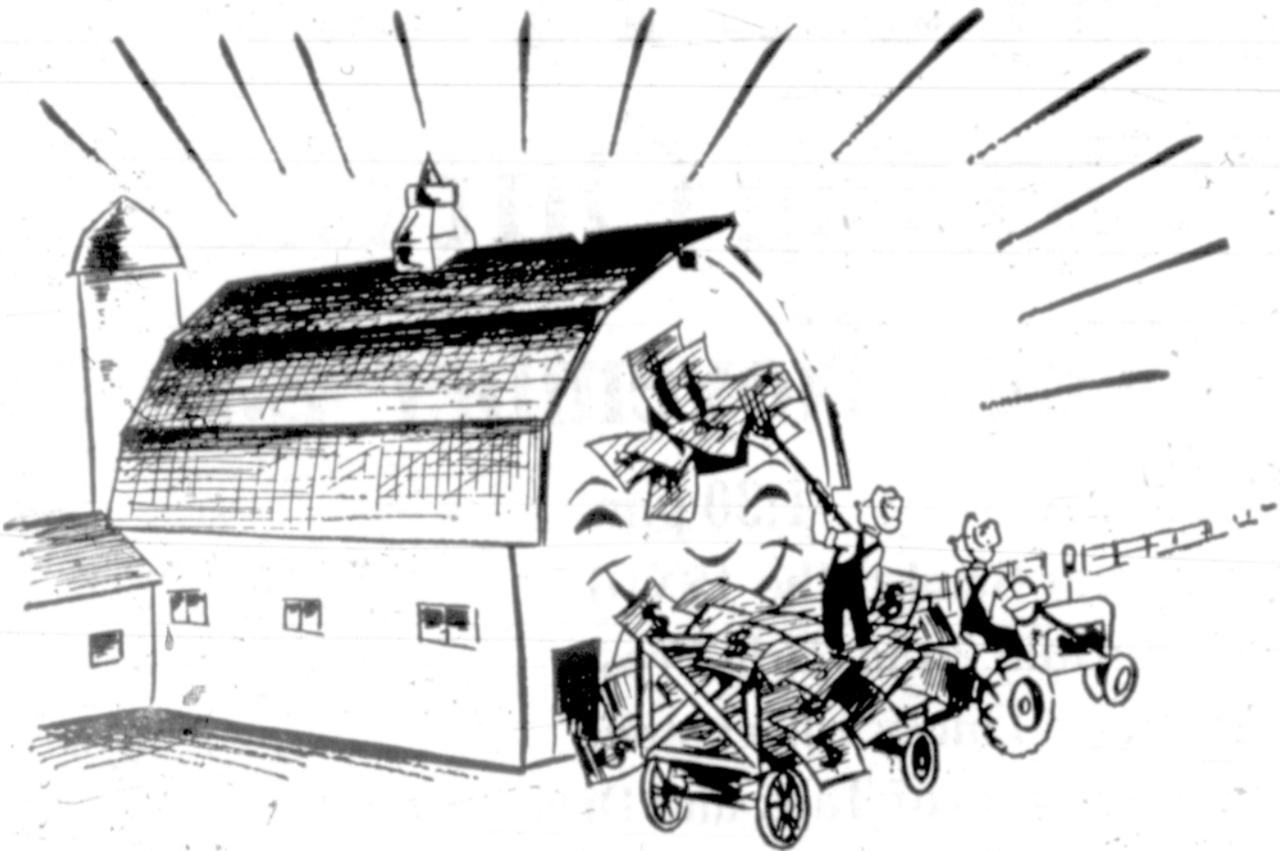
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
