People's Column

To the Editor:
 A matter which has given me a great deal of concern has been the brand of sportsmanship shown by some spectators, especially at contests between the Moro Schools and other schools. We are very quick to condemn one of our boys or girls for unsportsmanly behavior. Several codes have been worked out by different organizations. The Kiwanis International adopted the following Code of Sportsmanship:

1. I will cheer good plays by either team.
2. I will support the decisions of the officials.
3. I will remember that to build character is more important than to win games.
4. I will respect the rules and encourage others to do so.

At present, the major violation consists in making complimentary remarks about an umpire or referee's decision. Having had experience in this thankless job, I well realize that errors of judgment are possible even for the most conscientious official. It is perfectly legitimate to question a decision based on what appears to be a wrong interpretation of the rules. Matters of judgment should be respected. I have seen but very few officials who were deliberately unfair.

Who usually cries the loudest about a decision? You can bet your bottom dollar it is someone who has refused to be an official when asked or who has never volunteered his services. Out of fairness you should first be willing to assume an official's duties before accusing him of blindness, lack of good sense, or similar horrible deficiency.

You are going to say that half the fun of a ball game is in razzing the umpire. This may be justified in professional ball but it certainly is out of harmony with the spirit and purposes of amateur competition. Professional umpires get a good salary to stand up before the protests, insults, and pop bottles thrown by fans. Our officials serve for little pay and in many cases free gratis just to help the school out.

Without officials we can have no games. Unsportsmanly fans and players actions have made many good officials swear never to officiate again. It would be much easier for schools to maintain good reputations if the following code adopted by the Sportsmanship Brotherhood were studied and carried out.
