to February 3, 1950. This amended section of the mustering-out pay act applies only to those discharged before February of 1944, because every eligible serviceman since that time is assumed to have received the benefit at time of discharge.

The man's service must have been after December 7, 1941. The act provides payments of \$300 for overseas service, \$200 for more than 60 days' service not outside the United States or Alaska, and \$100 for active service of less than 60 days.
