Mr and Mrs J. O. Shull of Portland came Sunday to spend a few days here visiting her daughter, Mrs Boyce Blaylock and family.

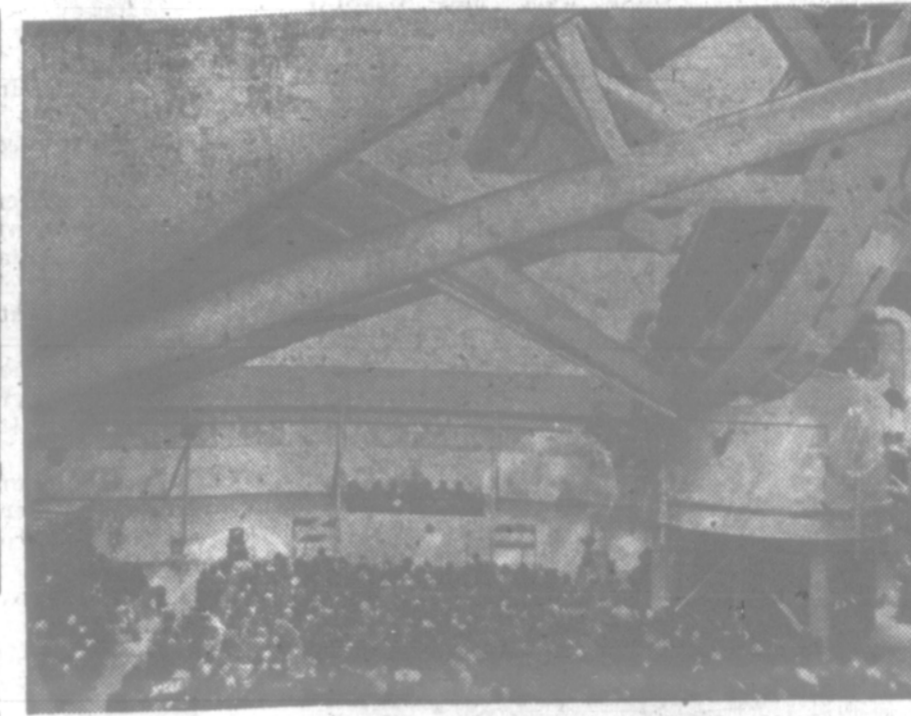

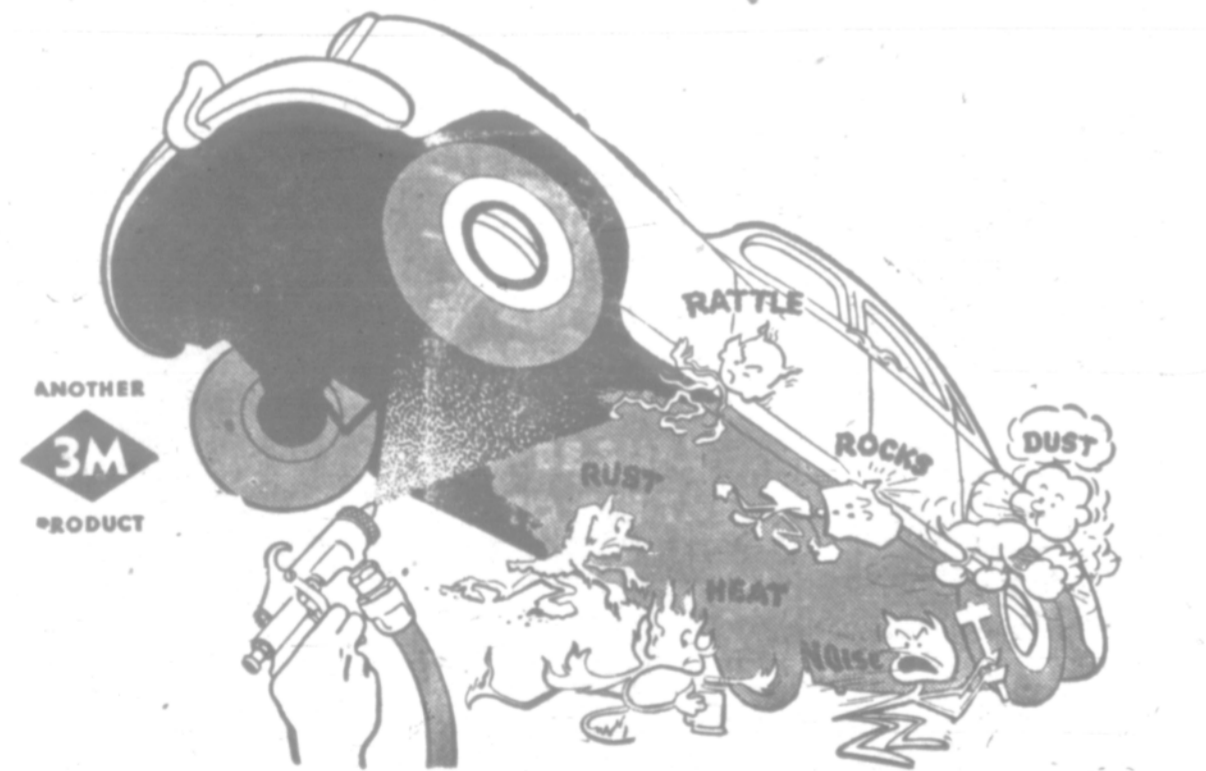
