Don Cox and Ralph Eakin of Moro went to Tacoma, Washington to attend a cattle sale Monday.

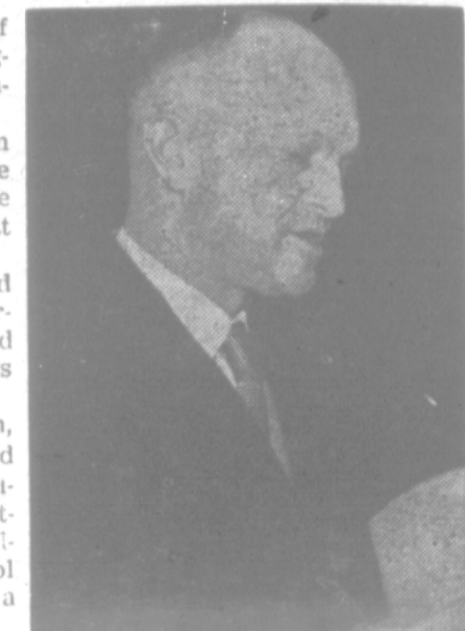
Mr and Mrs Warren Morgan left Wednesday for Condon where they will make their home as he will be employed by the Platt Freight line.
