A REPORT ON WHEAT
 The Oregon State College and
 U. S. Dept. of Agriculture report
 that the price of all grains de-
 clined during the week ending
 December 17; that the rail em-
 bargo on grain shipments into
 Portland was lifted early this
 week. The loading of ships has
 been resumed. Grain export ship-
 ments have been held up since
 the first week in September be-
 cause of the strike.

The harvesting of wheat is now
 getting underway in Argentina.
 Present indications are that this
 year's crop will produce around
 180 million bushels. This com-
 pares with 250 million bushels a
 year ago.

However, wheat growers in Ar-
 gentina are to receive higher
 prices for this year's smaller
 crop. The reported price is around
 \$1.86 a bushel, sacked, on the
 tracks at Buenos Aires. This ex-
 ceeds last year's price by 24c per
 bushel, and is the highest price
 on record for wheat growers in
 Argentina.
