The couple left immediately for a wedding trip to the Oregon coast. The bride wore a grey silk ensemble with white accessories. The newlyweds will

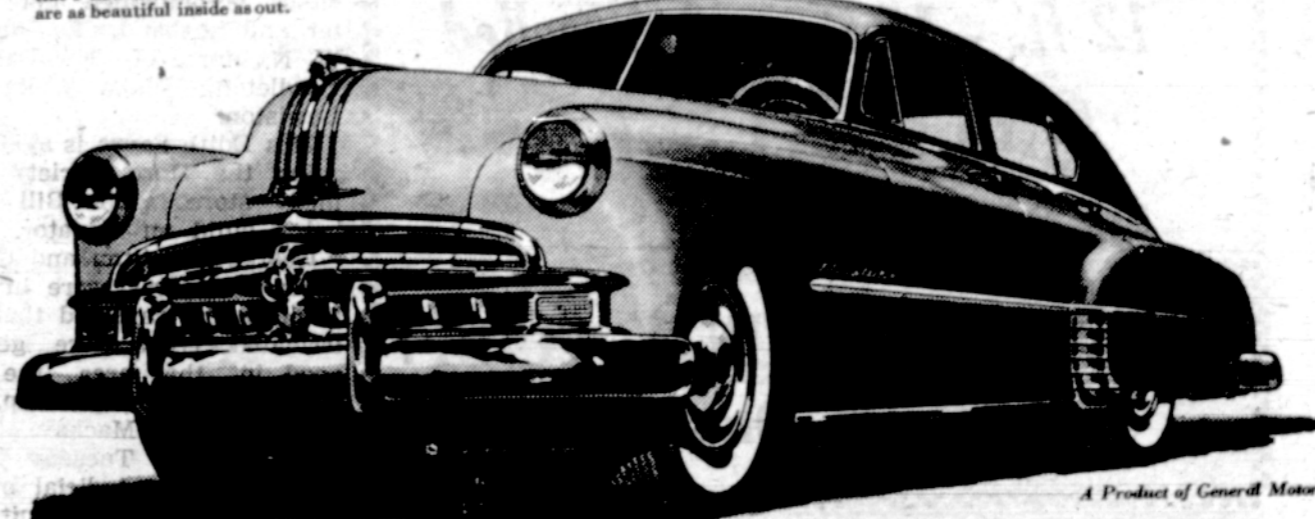
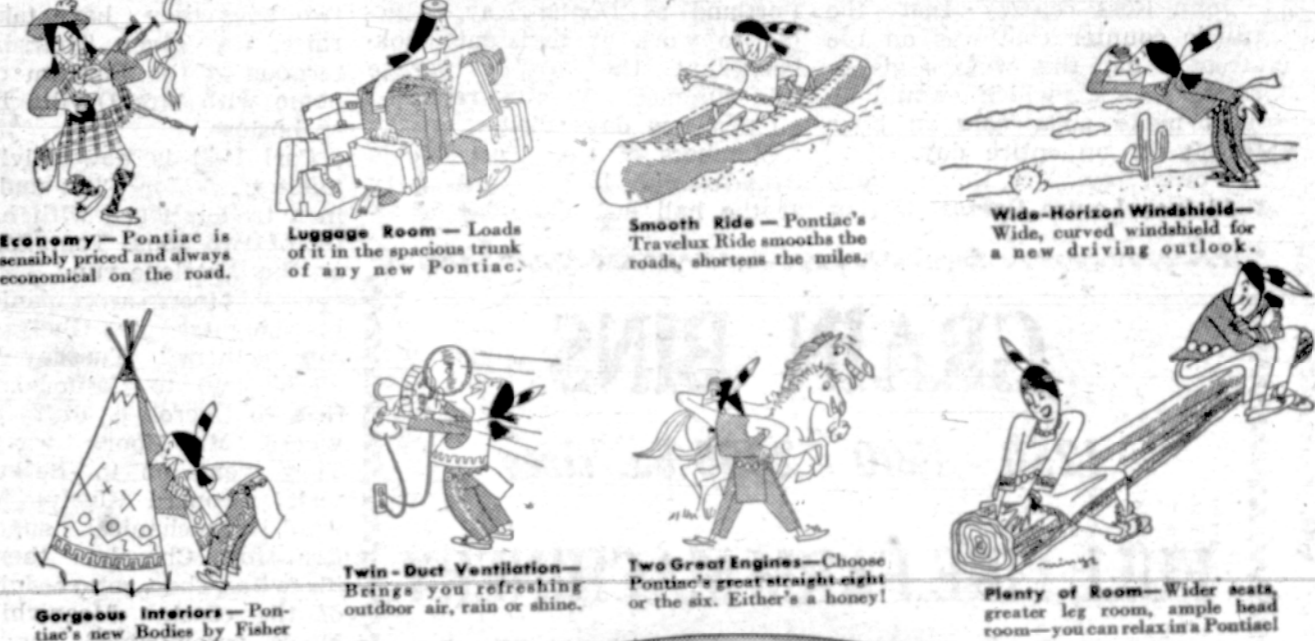
spend the summer in Grass Valley and will make their home in Eugene after the opening of the university in the fall
