### Range Needs Work

Range problems of the livestock industry in eastern Oregon were learned in a recent tour by T. W. Thompson, county agent. The tour conducted by the United States Forest service covered the Battle mountain, Bearwallow and Starkey areas of the Umatilla National Forest.

The research division of the Forest service places the emphasis of their work on the critical shortage of summer forage and the improvement of watershed conditions.

The greatest service to the livestock industry by the Forest service is to devise ways and means for improving and maintaining the forage production of these lands. The summer range lands are also the major water-

shed lands of the region. Maximum useable supplies of water are important to the economy of the Northwest and the Forest service is doing much to improve watershed conditions.

To accomplish its aims the Forest service has planned work along definite lines such as grazing management, range re-seeding, effects of logging on forage production, effects of big game use on forage production, etc.

Results of the use of a tiller for rocky land was observed during the tour in the Bearwallow area. The tiller, used for the first time, proved successful in helping revegetate rocky ridges which were producing only taw-

Mr and Mrs Ed Cunnion visited Mrs Tom Faharty at South Junction. Mrs Faharty is the widow of the late Mr. Faharty.

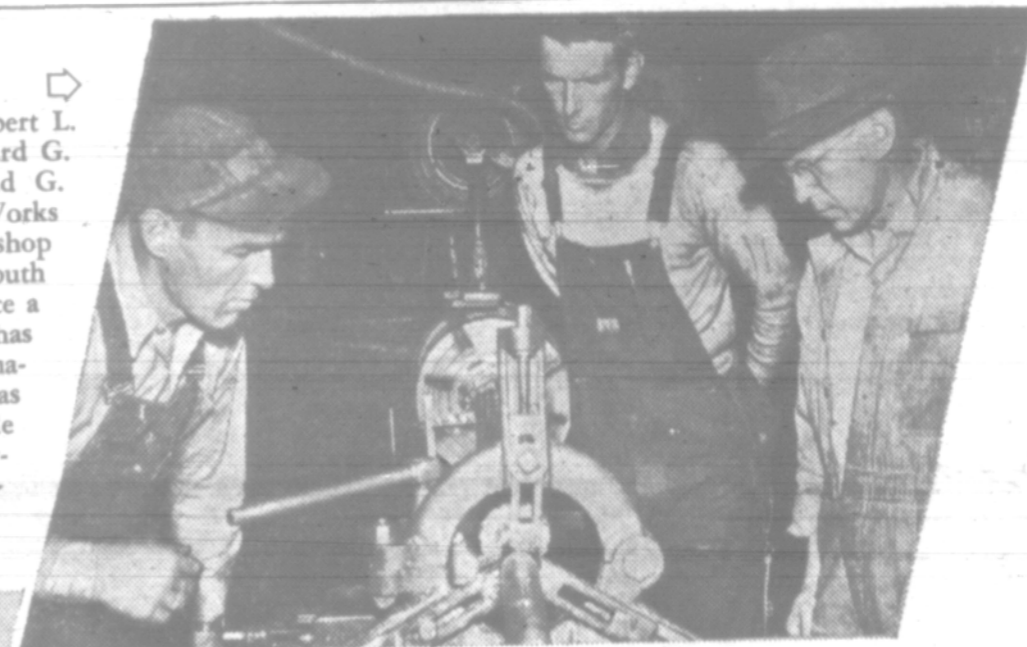
To those who are interested we wish to announce that Rev. Dixon of Prineville will hold church services at the school house August 7th at five o'clock. Everyone is welcome.

### THESE CRAFTSMEN SERVE OREGON

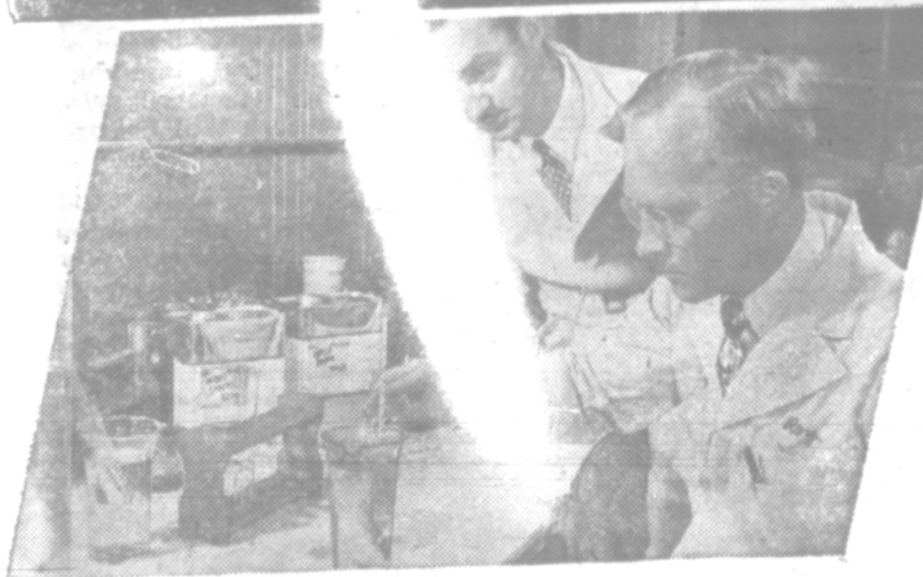
By pooling their abilities, machinist Robert L. Hobbs (left), his brother, welder Richard G. Hobbs (center), and draftsman Arnold G. Kortz built the large Hobbs Machine Works at Lebanon. ### TURNING SWAMPS INTO PASTURES

Dairy farmers in the Nestucca Valley—working together—have added 4425 acres to their pastures in eight years. Their South Tillamook County Soil Conservation District buys and operates necessary equipment. It clears, ditches (see photo), dikes and seeds the swamp-like bottom lands. Each farmer pays for work done on his land. Now the coastal valley has a total of 12,000 acres of pasture lands, with more being added. Here graze Jerseys and Guernseys whose milk becomes the famed Tillamook cheeses. Financial assistance from the First National at Tillamook helped the project get started and continues active in the reclamation work being carried on today.
