Interim Committee Starts Tax Study

The interim committee of the Oregon legislature formed for the study of the Oregon tax problem met Monday in Portland and Giles French, member from the house attended. Appointment of sub-committees to consider the four phases of the problem that seemed most pertinent was done by Howard Belton, state senator and committee chairman.

French will be chairman of the committee to study business tax proposals and other means of raising enough money to balance the 1951-52 budget. Other members will be Kelley Loe of the AF of L and Earl Day, former county judge and legislator of Jackson county. John Sell, state representative of The Dalles will be chairman of a sub-committee to study the possibility of barring the state from levying a property tax and the six percent limitation and will have Mr. Day and Mr. French as members.

Other committees will study proper co-ordination of state and local taxes and revenues and assessment methods. Other members of the committee are Senator Eugene Marsh of Yamhill county, and Mrs. Louise Humphries of Clackamas county, representing business. Mr. Loe represents labor and Mr. Day agriculture.

Fair Gets Under Way With Many Exhibits

Exhibits at the fair grounds are larger than for many years reported Art Bucholtz, fair board chairman, Thursday as the judging started for the 1949 show.

The board has arranged for three clown acts before the stand which will feature the Great Tod in a tight wire act, the Henrys in a chair act and Pat and Meatball with a revolving ladder. A small circus moved into town to play during the fair on the usual grounds in the flat.

Sunday has been named as Wasco county day and a group from The Dalles will meet at DeMoss and come on into Moro in a body. The Wasco county fair board will lead the cavalcade, a part of which will be mounted. There will be a three entry pony express race, at the fair on Saturday and Sunday reported the fair board Thursday with a three lap race.
