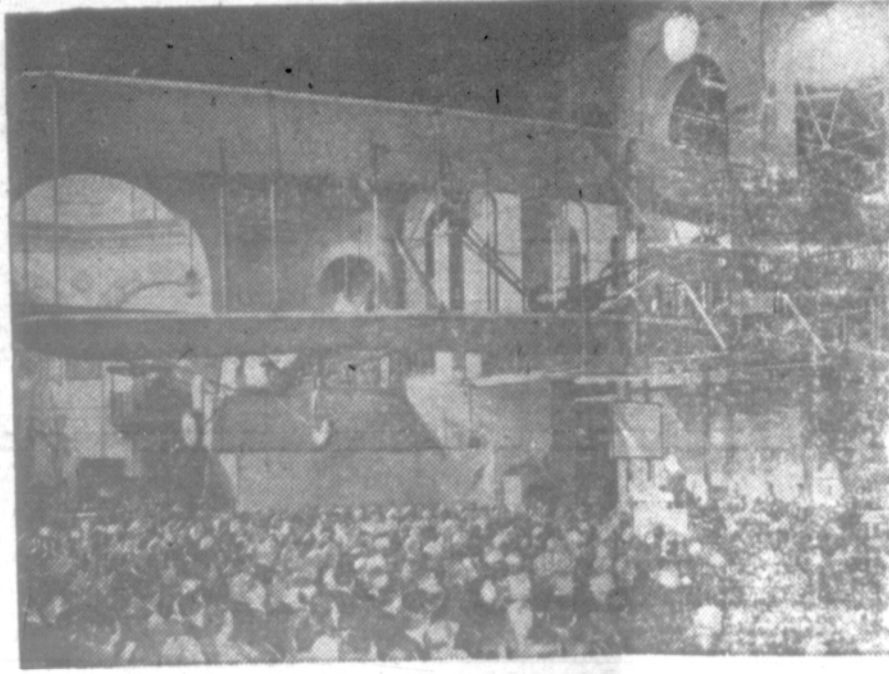
BOOKS PRINTED
