**P&L TAXES PAID**

A check for \$7,248.44 in payment of 1949 real and personal taxes on Pacific Power & Light company in Sherman county was turned over to the county by Lawrence Kirby, local manager for the utility.

This year's Sherman county payment was 34 per cent larger than last year's, Kirby said, and was part of more than \$944,000 paid by the company to 15 Oregon counties in advance of the November 15 due date.

Kirby said that total direct taxes carried by the Pacific system this year will exceed \$3,000,000.
