Rufus Boys Take Forstry For Study

The Rufus Lookouts was chosen as the name of the 4-H Forestry club by the sixteen members at their first meeting recently.

Howard Steward was elected to serve as president of the club. Jack Steward and Paul Blackburne were elected to the offices of vice-president and secretary, respectively. The boys elected as their news reporter Gayle Eaton and Buzz Brand as song leader.

Mr. Donal Brislain, instructor at the Rufus school, is serving as local leader and Wayne Eaton as assistant leader.

The boys ranging in age from 10 to 17 have planned a good program for the club year. Each member will learn the common names and be able to identify at least 5 trees. At least ten trees provided by the Oregon Forestry nursery will be planted by every member. An over night or week end camping trip will be held during the spring where they will obtain instruction and practice in woodsmanship. Every member will keep a record of their forestry work and exhibit a forestry board of five kinds of forestry trees at the county fair in September.
