The Grass Valley Woman's club is sponsoring a silver tea Thursday, April 20, to be held at the Masonic hall.

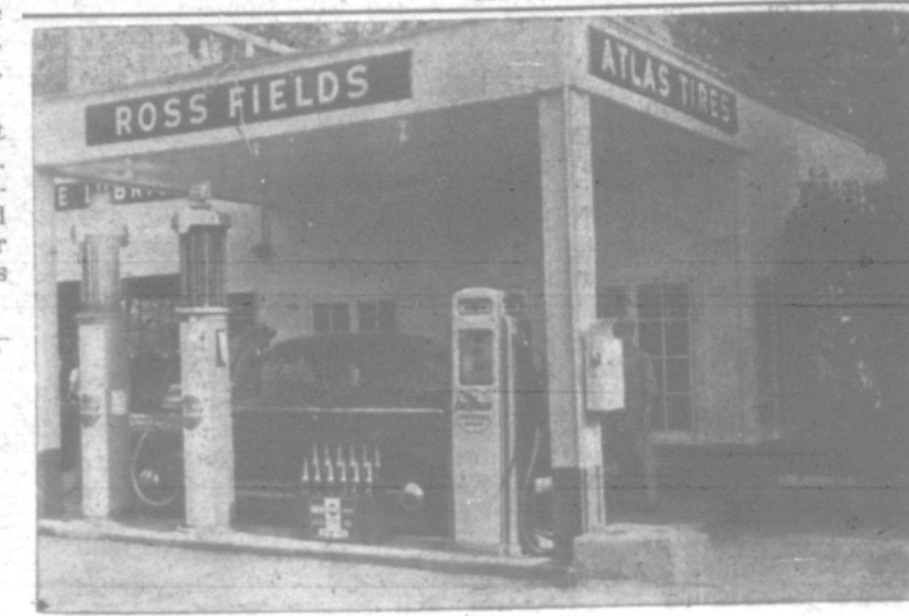
