Morse has said repeatedly that it is neither necessary nor even desirable to balance the national budget. Take another recent example of the Junior Senator's position on a most significant issue: While Morse has said he is against the proposed CVA act, as it is now written, what did he do on the matter of the proposed Columbia Basin accounting pool? Senator Cordon termed it "socialistic" and a start toward CVA. Cordon voted against the bill. Morse voted for it, along with Democrats Magnuson of Washington, and Taylor of Idaho.

Abraham Lincoln said this nation cannot exist "half slave and half free." Neither can the Republican party. The Republicans of Oregon cannot carry water on both shoulders. If, at the top of the ticket next November, the Republicans of Oregon attempt to defend a "liberal" on one hand and a conservative on the other, the party will go down inevitably to defeat.
