POSTAL SERVICE

The postoffice department is getting criticism from all over these days and for many reasons. Most of them have to do with curtailment of service and contemplated increases in rates.

Recently mail service was halted in many cities; service has been cut in many rural areas; there is little speed in the movement of letters to their destination.

First thing the postal service could do would be to charge the departments of government for their postage. Many persons and firms receive as many letters from the government as from private persons.

Through the parcel post the government transports small packages below cost. It is used extensively because it is handier and cheaper than express.

Blame for a part of the deficit is placed on newspapers and magazines that are mailed at a low rate. As far as this newspaper is concerned it will be willing to pay for its part of the deficit if others will do likewise.

The postal department might find some means of hiring help other than by political manipulation. It is hard to encourage an employee to be efficient if he knows that his job depends on some petty political boss and not the proper performance of his job.

If other departments of the government are as inefficient as the postoffice department, a general overhaul is needed and we suspicion that that may be the case. Yet, the Hoover report can barely get a hearing.

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CHARTER AMENDMENT SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL AN ACT

To amend the charter of the City of Moro, Oregon, adopted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon and approved February 17, 1899, and to amend all amendments thereof by adding a new chapter authorizing the Council to improve the city by constructing, reconstructing, repairing, or maintaining streets and drains of said City and issue and sell improvement bonds in the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) to provide funds with which to make said improvements, and to provide a tax levy to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF MORO, OREGON, that the Charter of said City, adopted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon and approved February 17, 1899 as amended be and the same hereby is amended by adding thereto a new chapter to read as follows:

CHAPTER XVII
Section 1. The Council of the City of Moro is authorized to improve the city by constructing, reconstructing, repairing, or maintaining streets and drains of said City. For the purpose of providing funds with which to pay the cost of said improvements the Council is authorized to issue and sell general obligation improvement bonds of the City in the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) Said bonds shall be in such form and mature as determined by the Council.

Section 2. The debt limitations contained in the Charter of said City shall not apply to the bonds hereby authorized.

Section 3. The Council of the City shall include in the annual tax levy a special additional levy in a sum sufficient to pay the principal of and the interest on the bonds hereby authorized as it becomes due.

RESOLVED further that the following ballot title is hereby adopted for said amendment: CHARTER AMENDMENT SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL

Shall the Charter of the City of Moro, Oregon, be amended, by adding thereto a new chapter, providing for the issuance of improvement bonds of the City in the sum of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) to provide funds with which to improve the streets and drains of the City, and providing a special tax levy to pay the principal of and the interest on said bonds?
