Almost any half grown boy knows that if you stick your nose into other people's business pretty soon some one is going to take a poke at it. That bit of practical and useful knowledge is something the United States state department hasn't learned.

At the beginning of what may be a third world war this nation has its few forces scattered all over the world, across two oceans in almost every continent. We have planned to have no more difficulty about it than one might expect in taking a basket of food to a sick neighbor.

The solid facts of international existence seem to have escaped the present leaders of this nation. History, if consulted, would have told them the value of force. The president has been insistent that a 44 unit air force was sufficient and despite the advice of the senate that is all we have. The draft was unpopular and so instead of losing votes the administration preferred to lose the army. We have dissipated our resources all over the world instead of making ourselves strong and now, in time of danger, have a flock of supplicants on our protect either ourselves or them. hands and little with which to There is no indication that any of the nations on which we have showered our generosity will field a single division in our behalf.

So, what. We can either fight in Korea across the five or six thousand miles of the Pacific. can retreat actually and diplomatically, or try to appease Russia. Neither course will be easy and appeasement is impos-

sible. It is unfortunate that the people have so little confidence in the state department and administration. Some would say that it is unfortunate that the state department has been such that it lost the confidence of the people. But we can hardly change it now. We must go on with it and hope that it will make an acceptable program for the nation.

It is the observation of the writer that a vast majority of the citizens of this area would prefer that this nation stayed closer to home and make fewer commitments in foreign lands. As a theory that is probably all right; as an actuality we did go abroad with our promises and do have our nose protruded into the business of many lands. We are not prepared to protect it. We are getting it hit. Upon how we react depends our future.
