Chris Taylor returned to Moro this week after several weeks in Emanuel hospital in Portland.

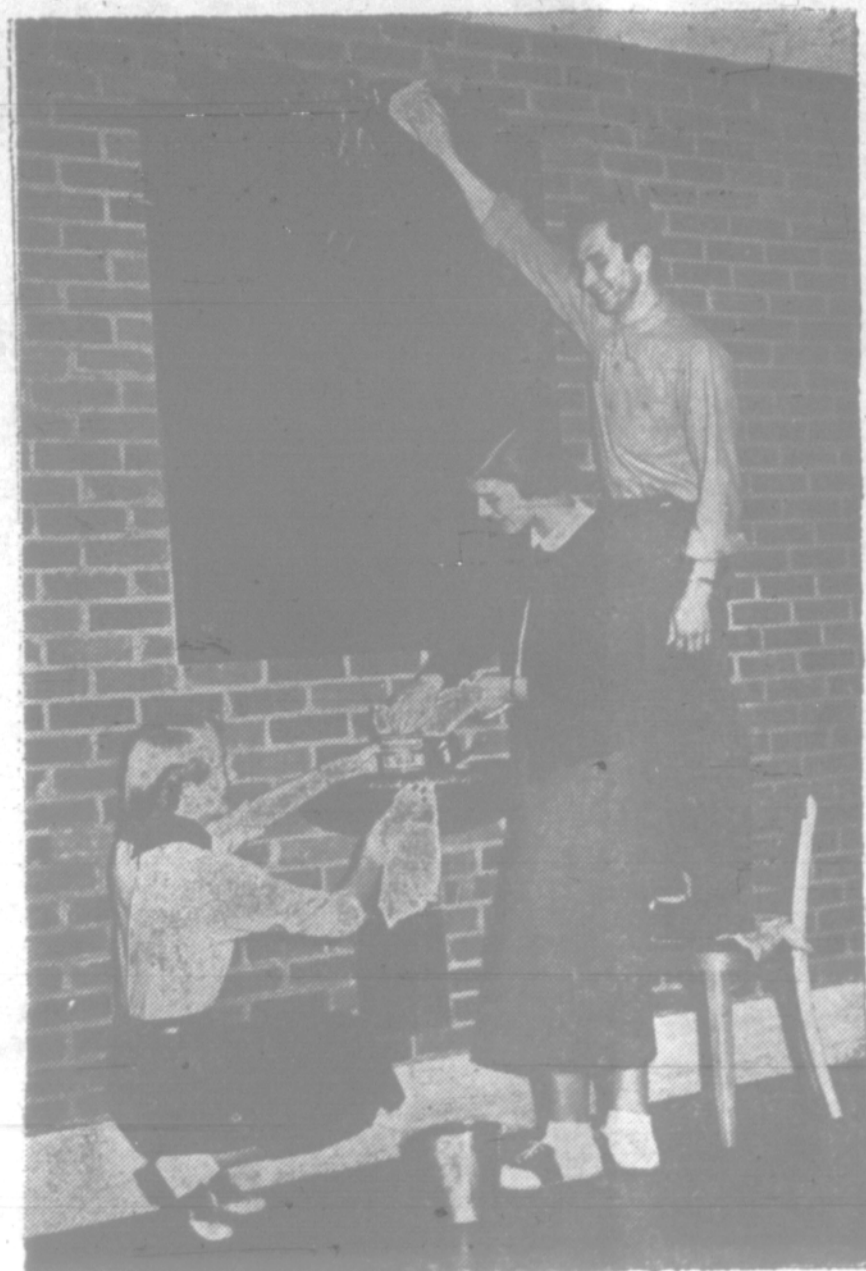
E. Amidon finally has a well with water in it. Drillers found water sufficient for farm needs at 700 feet.
