OREGON LAGS IN DAIRY COW BREEDING PROGRAM

While one out of every six dairy cows in the nation will be bred artificially this year, Oregon with 23,000 cows in 22 artificial breeding associations, ranks thirty-third among states in artificially-bred cows, reports Harold Ewalt, Oregon State college extension dairy specialist.

In 16 county associations, there are 2,762 herds using semen provided by the Oregon Dairy Breeders association.

The specialist says Wisconsin is the ranking state in terms of cows bred artificially. Ranking first for the ninth consecutive year, almost 800,000 cows will be artificially bred in Wisconsin this year.

More than four million cows were enrolled in 1,653 artificial breeding associations located in 48 states and Alaska on January 1, 1951, according to Ewalt. Oregon has 235,000 dairy cows.
