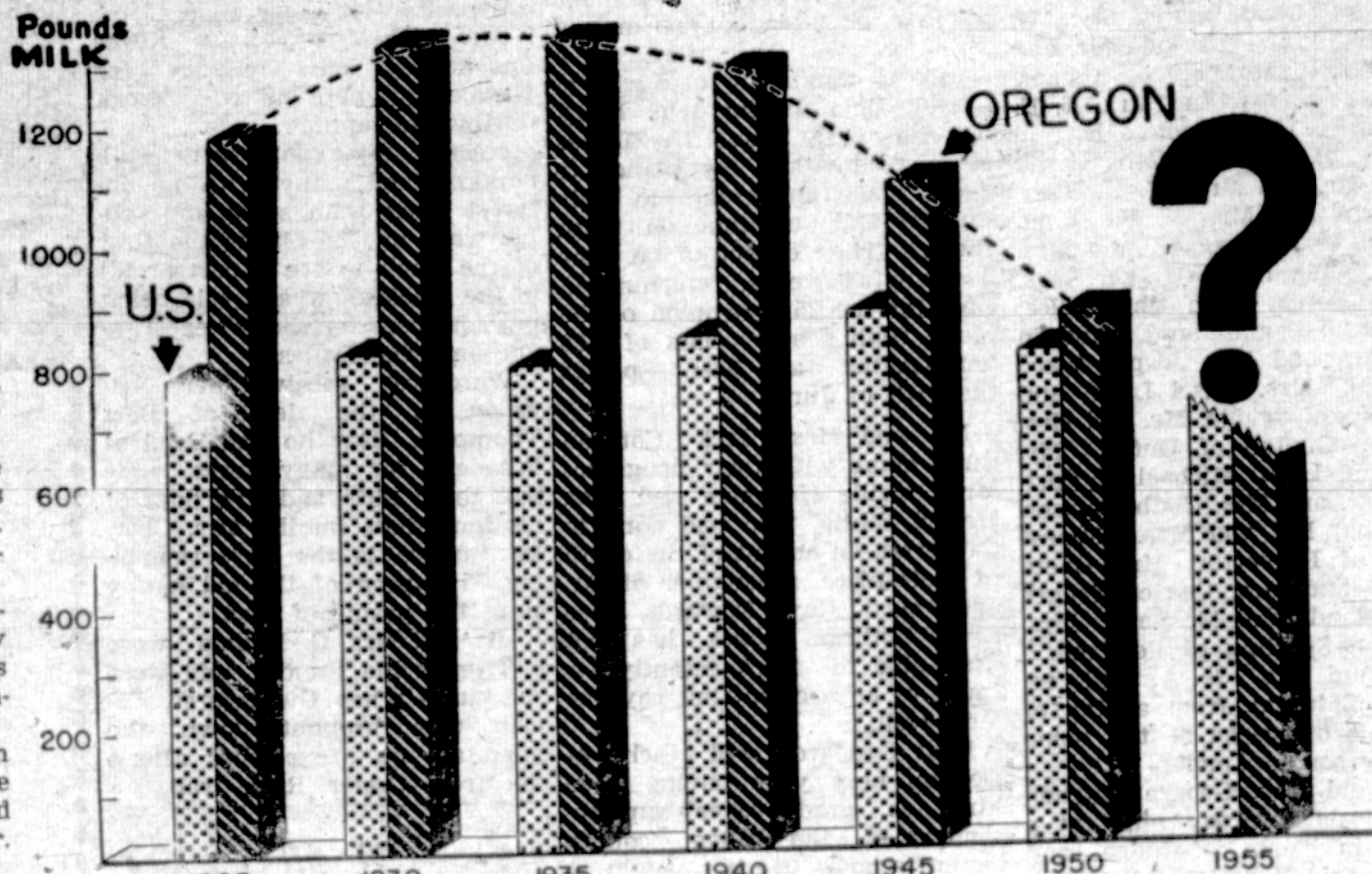
Mr. and Mrs. George Fox and sons George Jr. and Jimmy, spent the weekend in Corvallis.

PER CAPITA MILK PRODUCTION GOING DOWN

OSC Extension Service, January 1951



Oregon State college extension agricultural economists have chosen June Dairy Month to show graphically how the state's per capita milk production is slipping. High point within the past 25 years was 1935 when 1,223 pounds of milk were produced for every person living in the state. Today, the figure is about 850 pounds. If the trend of the past 15 years continues, say the economists, Oregon residents will soon find their milk supply below the national average. Production has not kept pace with the state's population growth.
