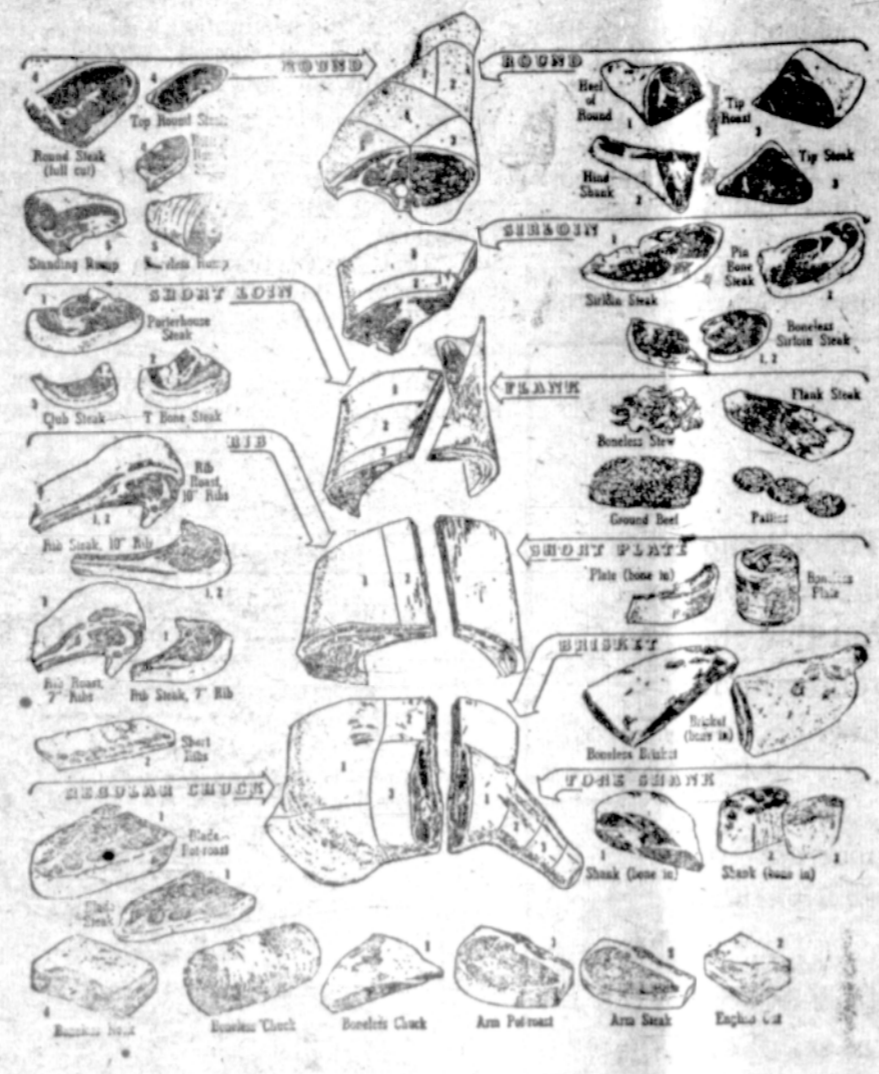

Each of these beef cuts is subject to county- and-cents ceilings at your retail meat shop. Your retailer has been provided with the dollar- and-cents ceiling prices for the various cuts in a separate list. You can ask to see these prices. Effective May 14, 1951, prices must be posted by your butcher. Lower than posted prices will be effective on August 1 and another reduction will be effective on October 1.
