FOREIGN POLICY

The advent of Senator Taft into the race for the presidency has brought comment on what his foreign policy might be in case he were elected. The administration is particularly anxious for Mr. Taft to run as it has a ready-made attack on his ideas about foreign matters. We are not familiar with what Mr. Taft thinks about our international entanglements nor what he might do as president. But as a reader of newspapers and magazines and books we are to some extent familiar with actions taken on foreign affairs by this administration in the last 20 years and are sure that Mr. Taft would find it difficult to pursue a policy half as dangerous and destructive.

Since 1932 this nation has been engaged in two world wars without gaining anything but death and debt. We have gone crusading all over the world and have yet to be successful except for short periods. Our foreign policy is entirely indefensible.

We are now fighting Russia with everything but guns and we believe history will show that it has not been necessary. It is true that Russian leaders have said that the success of communism entailed defeat of capitalism but there is little to indicate that the defeat had to be by war. It might have been that the Russian was thinking that communism could not survive in a world alongside of a successful capitalistic system—in which case he would have been correct.

The Russians are described as Orientals in their thinking which sounds reasonable. That being the case their approach to all problems would be much different than that of Americans who have a strong Anglo-Saxon intermixture. Orientals go about solving their problems by stealth and intrigue. They have lots of time and are seldom impatient.

The usual Anglo-Saxon approach to a perplexing problem is the doubted but and the harsh word. They meet problems directly, face to face, and they never have any time.

It may well be that in this phase of preparation for war we may get all ready with atom and supplies and find no one ready to fight. In the next phase, after our bluster is over, the Russians may take the lead by the injection of ideas into the minds of men all over the world. Our foreign policy is based on the use of guns; theirs on the use of minds.

If we are unable to obtain the support of nations now wavering between the west and Russia we will have lost whether we have a supply of atomic bombs or not.

Our foreign policy has been on the childish level of doubled fists and angry words. Our communistic bent "liberals" in the state department and their administration dupes gave China to the Reds; India and Indonesia and Iran and Burma are going the same direction although with less help from our state department. When they are safely in the fold of Russia the battle will have been lost to us regardless of what happens in the decadent countries of Europe.

The communists are doing a better job of selling their theory of government than we are even though they have much less to sell. We could trade some state department brawn for some brains. Maybe Taft couldn't or wouldn't help. That we do not know. But we need a new state department if this nation is not going to be defeated in the contest between capitalism and communism.

NO BEER WITH GAMBLING

We find no confusion in the opinions of Attorney General George Neuner about the sale of beer in places where there is illegal gambling. He merely said that a beer seller's license could not be granted where illegal operations were carried on. That has been the law for some time and we think it would generally be approved.

The pictures and the stories about homeless working men being deprived of either beer or their card games probably added to the current disfavor in

which commissioner Jake Bennett finds himself but they proved to be unfounded as a source of complaint.

Nearly all of the present trouble over gambling and liquor comes from Oregon's confusing laws about gambling. Originally we had a constitutional provision against lotteries and laws against gambling. Slot machines and similar devices have been classed as lotteries and then the supreme court decided that betting on the dogs or horses would not be a lottery because it contained an element of skill. Those who have found betting on the dogs fully as much of a lottery as guessing the winning number on a punch board are not pleased over the situation.

Despite the entrance of beer selling into the controversy it is the gambling that is at fault and is in process of elimination in Portland. Mayor Lee has made real progress in doing away with gambling.

FALL EATING

This is the time of year the housewife looks up the recipe for pumpkin pie and fruit cake and begins to think about Thanksgiving. A new method of making apple pie may vary the usual one also.

Within a month Thanksgiving will be with us. We Americans are wont to consider our annual feast day as a day set apart for giving thanks for the bounties of nature. It is more than that. It is also a day established to mark a time of good eating, that is: Fall.

When the harvest is in there is plenty to eat and while we wait until late in November to observe the season formally there is a world of good eating in Oregon long before that. The beef is fat and rich, hog killing time brings luscious food, the garden yields beans, tomatoes, root crops and potatoes and maybe a few late ears of corn, the fall run of salmon, venison from the hills and apples aplenty make the autumn eating something to be remembered.

ROAD MARKING

The granges of Sherman county are getting concerned over the lack of road markers along county roads in this county. Also being considered is a program of marking directions to individual farms.

The idea is a good one and it should be carried on to conclusion which will entail a good deal of planning and sign painting and measuring of road miles. Many counties have long lists of farmer names at every cross road so that a visitor in search of a farm can find it with few directions.

Sherman county is an easy place in which to direct a stranger because the land is in square sections and roads generally run straight with the compass. There are a few exceptions to that rule, but not so many as where roads follow creeks and farms were laid out by donation-land claims. At one time the roads were pretty well marked here but it has been some time since the county road department made a project of signing the roads. The county court can assist in that work—and probably will.

Putting up signs to indicate the direction to individual farms is a different project although along the same line. It would serve a good purpose if it were done properly and we wish the grange complete success in its efforts although we do think that there is a lot of work entailed.
