Sherman County Asked For One Set To Enter In Statewide Square Dance Contest

All counties have been asked to provide one square dance set for a state contest. Sherman county has plenty of good square dancers that could represent the county in this contest. Any volunteers?

Fair time is a long way off but we would like volunteers who are qualified to judge open classes of beef cattle, dairy, saddle horses, poultry, crops, horticulture, flowers, and other products at the county fairs over the state. A livestock training meeting for judges will be held May 27 and 28 at Oregon State college branch experiment station at Union. Any county people in this sort of work at one or two county fairs please drop by office and fill out an application.

There is no substitute for a good sharp knife in castrating. The elastator has been used successfully on young animals. In any operation cleanliness is essential.

Any of the coal tar disinfectants such as cresote or lysol are very good. While curing any spring marking of calves this gives a fine opportunity for removing horns. Dehorning by two

months of age removes the horn button before attachment to the skull. Great loss of blood is thus not a factor and eventual profit is increased around \$10 per head.

To illustrate the seriousness of Foot and Mouth disease at the Cattlemen's meeting Monday Dr. Thistlewaite made this comment. "An infected animal is so great a spreader of the disease that if a cow walked across the road and several days later 100 cows walked down or across the same road within a week eighty percent would be infected with the disease."

The use of trashy fallow is the single best erosion control method. It is not complete, but it has more erosion prevention effect than any other one practice. The erosion control effect of trashy fallow is in direct proportion to the amount of straw on the surface up to two tons per acre. Sweep type implements are superior to disc type for making penetration. The wider the sweep the less trouble with clogging, but the poorer the job. The small sweeps pulverize more, but kill more weeds and volunteer.

The city council of Moro decided in a special meeting Wednesday night that it was interested in the purchase of a fire truck up to a definite limit which discussion showed was not over \$1500 although that sum was not mentioned in the resolution which was passed.

It reads: Resolved, the city is interested in the purchase of a fire truck and will be willing to meet with any group of rural residents about it.

Oregon Motor Gas Consumption Heavy

It took 541,034,754 gallons of gasoline to supply Oregon motor vehicle traffic last year, a net gain of 5.9 percent over gasoline consumption in 1950 in spite of decreases during the months of July, August and December sales figures filed with secretary of state's office reveal.

This continues the steady upward spiral of Oregon gasoline sales that began at the close of World War II and sets a new all-time high. Total 1951 gallonage was 81.6 percent higher than in 1941.

For the first time since the war's end, however, lowered sales were noted in three of the monthly tabulations. A reduction of 0.36 percent was recorded in July 1.10 percent in August and 4.75 percent in December, as compared with sales during the same months of the preceding year.

LOOK OVER DRIVERS' MANUAL BEFORE TAKING LICENSE EXAMINATION

Better look over the Oregon "driver's manual" before you take an examination for an Oregon driver's license.

Last year 38 percent of all applicants taking the test failed on their first try, reports the secretary of state's driver's division. Most muffed the law test a written portion of the examination that checks knowledge of Oregon's rules of the road.

License officials said approximately 70,000 persons applied for their first Oregon driver licenses in 1951 but 26,520 failed the examination of their first attempt. Of this number 22,616 were successful on their second, third or later attempts.

All applicants are given copies of the driver's manual, which lists license requirements, the nature of the exam and explains the important traffic laws. Some persons, officials said, apparently feel they need not read the manual and consequently get a low score on the law test.

OSC Soil Specialist To Spend Year At National Capital

Arthur S. King, Oregon State college extension soil conservation specialist for the past 22 years, has been granted a 12 month leave of absence effective April 4 to head the mutual security administration's fertilizer, seeds and pesticides branch with headquarters in Washington, D. C.

The mutual security administration, formerly ECA, administers the point-four program in participating countries abroad.

In his post, King will be responsible for fertilizer purchases, delivery, and information about demand in MSA co-operating nations. He will also be in charge of the technical assistance phase of the fertilizer, seeds, and pesticide program here and in foreign countries.

King's leave is subject to approval by the state board of higher education.
