Functional Is Word For Design Of New Bank

The beautiful blonde, birch fixtures used throughout the new building blend extremely well with the yellow, gray and pink weave in the asphalt tile floor, and overhead fluorescent and incandescent lighting is set into an acoustical ceiling.

Also all new safe deposit boxes have been installed in the larger, more convenient vault. The most modern type vault door and reinforced concrete walls assure maximum protection for customers' valuables.

Two new safe deposit booths are being provided for customers.

Tellers' windows in Sherman county branch's new home have been increased to four and counters run along the rear and side of the lobby.

Another brand new feature being introduced to the Sherman county area is the night depository service. A special receiving night depository has been built into the building adjacent to the main entrance, and a night light for the convenience of customers making deposits after dark.

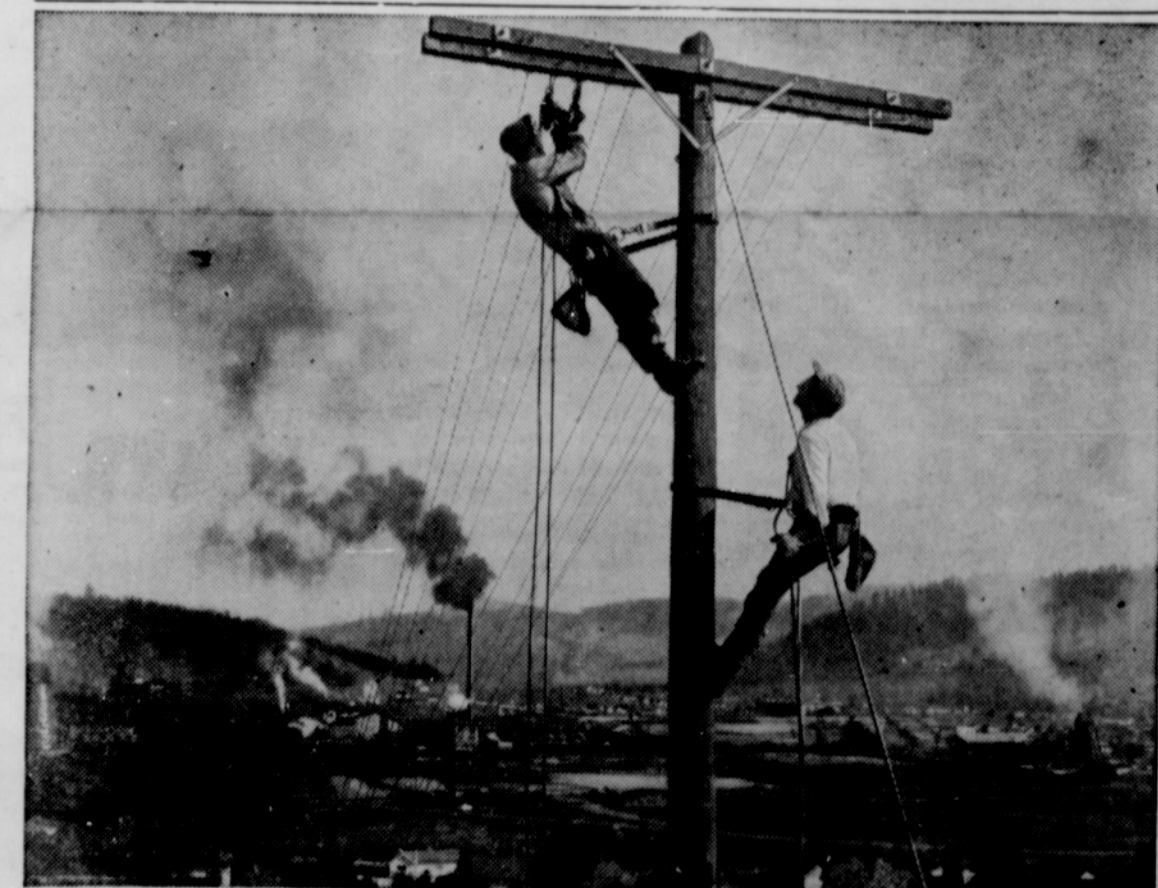
