LET'S NOT FIGHT— UNLESS NECESSARY

A citizen of Oregon, whether rural or urban, might be a little concerned with the tirade in the Oregonian last Friday about the amendment to the house bill for a constitutional convention. As amended it gives each county at least one delegate to the proposed convention as does the senate bill, written by a resident of Multnomah county.

If the editors of that important newspaper were to get out over Oregon they would soon discover that rural Oregonians have little intention of following the sidewalk sophistry of the cities. In fact, we like to think that a large part of the Portland residents themselves are wise enough to realize that their city only exists because rural Oregon provides the economic substance for their livelihood.

In both of Oregon's constitutional conventions each county had a representative and the state does not seem to have suffered greatly therefrom. True, in the first convention Charles Meigs, necessarily of Wasco county, that being the only one east of the Cascades, had a large territory. He tried to have the eastern boundary of the state placed on the summit of the mountains but was unsuccessful. It may be necessary to do it yet.

The Oregonian is also upset because of a bill that would give more of the state's highway funds to rural counties. The distribution of these funds has kept Multnomah county from paying a road tax for years. The law regarding the division of county road money gives cities but one half of their normal amount. Towns over the state contribute a half of their road taxes to the country surrounding them and make no objection.

The money goes toward building roads that bring farmers into the towns. Likewise state highways bring rural residents into Portland. It seems reasonable to suppose that a wiser course for the city would be to advocate such a distribution instead of selfishly hoarding every dime possible while expecting Oregonians to come to the city despite rebuffs.

As Oregon grows other trade centers will gradually take over much of the business that once went to Portland. This has been and will be hastened by a self-centered attitude on the part of the city. Good business men do not kick customers in the teeth, neither do they assume an attitude of arrogant superiority over them.

It does not help Oregon to battle between rural and urban residents. Few rural Oregonians welcome such a battle although they are growing in number and voice. But rural Oregon isn't going to be ruled by the city, politically, economically, nor socially.

SCHOOL ELECTION

Next Tuesday the legal voters of School District No. 17 will decide whether or not they will bond themselves for \$360,000 to construct a new high school building. It is a decision they will probably make rather light-heartedly and in a spirit of determination to assert themselves.

The county needs a new high school building and one large enough to adequately house the 100 or so high school students of the county. And arrangements should be made to give them all their secondary education within it. The difficulties of this course of action are real difficulties, perhaps greater than the ones of paying for the building.

The building will not solve the problem of education, only the problem of housing.

The attitude of most of the residents of the Moro district seems to be that they will build the new high school and hire a good staff and trust to the eventual wisdom of parents throughout the county to send their children to it. That is a very generous attitude.
