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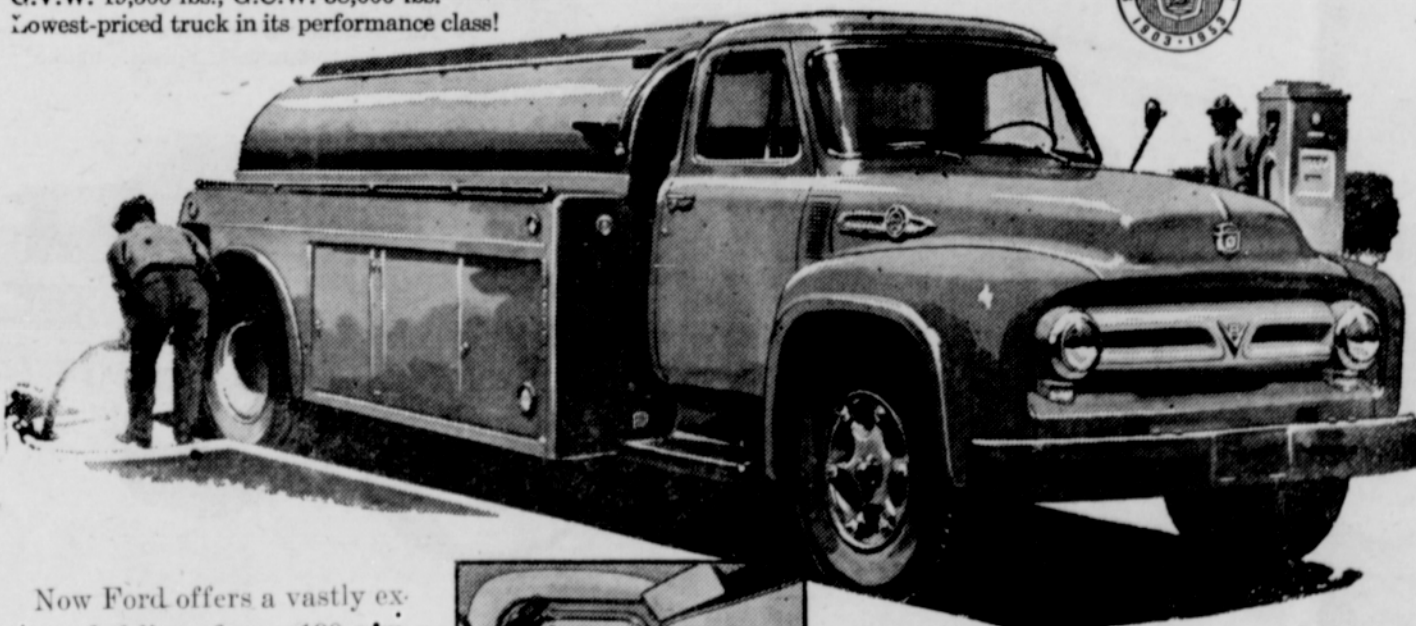
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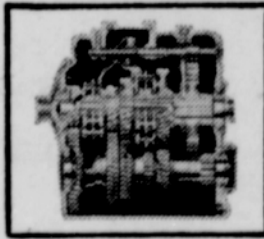
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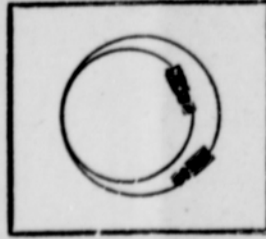
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Weatherford and son Grant all of Arlington spent one day last week visiting at the George Fox home.
