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CHEMICALS AID THE KEEPING OF GRAIN

Grain insects may be controlled by good housekeeping and use of residual sprays prior to storage of the new crop, County Agent T. W. Thompson, indicates.

The Oregon State college agricultural experiment station, in cooperation with eight Sherman county farmers, has investigated methods of grain insect control over the past two years. Results of treatment have shown extremely low infestation says the county agent. Over 175,000 bushels in farm storage facilities were treated during the insect control investigation.

Recommendations for control of grain insects in storage facilities following the experimental work require spraying walls, floors, headhouse, pits and drive-ways with residual spray. Methoxychlor or DDT at a 2½% concentration is suggested by applying solution to the point of runoff. About 2 gallons to 1,000 square feet of surface space is required, Thompson indicates.

Emulsion type material or wettable powder of methoxychlor or DDT may be used. Where mechanical agitation in the spraying is not available emulsion type material or 40 pounds of 50% wettable powder or 100 gallons of water makes a 2½% spray solution.

Pyrene, a grain protectant, may be mixed with grain as it is put into storage. The material may be sprayed in the wheat or used as a dust. This method has kept grain free of insects for a two year period here in the county.
