**Wheat Price Support
Set at \$2.20 a Bushel**

Official notification has been received by the local PMA committee of price supports on the 1954 crop of wheat, barley and oats.

A national average price support of not less than \$2.20 a bushel has been announced for wheat. This minimum support price is 90 per cent of the August 15, 1953 wheat parity price of \$2.45. A minimum support price is announced at this time in accordance with the "forward pricing" provisions of the Agricultural Act of 1949. If the wheat parity price as of July 1, 1954 is higher, the support price will be increased to 90 per cent of parity at that time. Support price for the 1953 crop now going under loan is at a national average of \$2.21. The 1953 Sherman county loan rate is now at \$2.17 for warehouse and \$2.27 for wheat stored on the farm. The Sherman county loan rates for the 1954 wheat will be announced later. Barley and oats produced in 1954 will be supported at 85 per cent of parity, the same percentage of parity which is in effect for supports on these grains in 1953. The national average price support rates for these crops is 85 per cent of the parity price as of September 15, 1953, and will be \$1.15 a bushel for barley and 75 cents a bushel for oats. The loan rate in the county for 1953 barley is now \$1.28 a bushel.

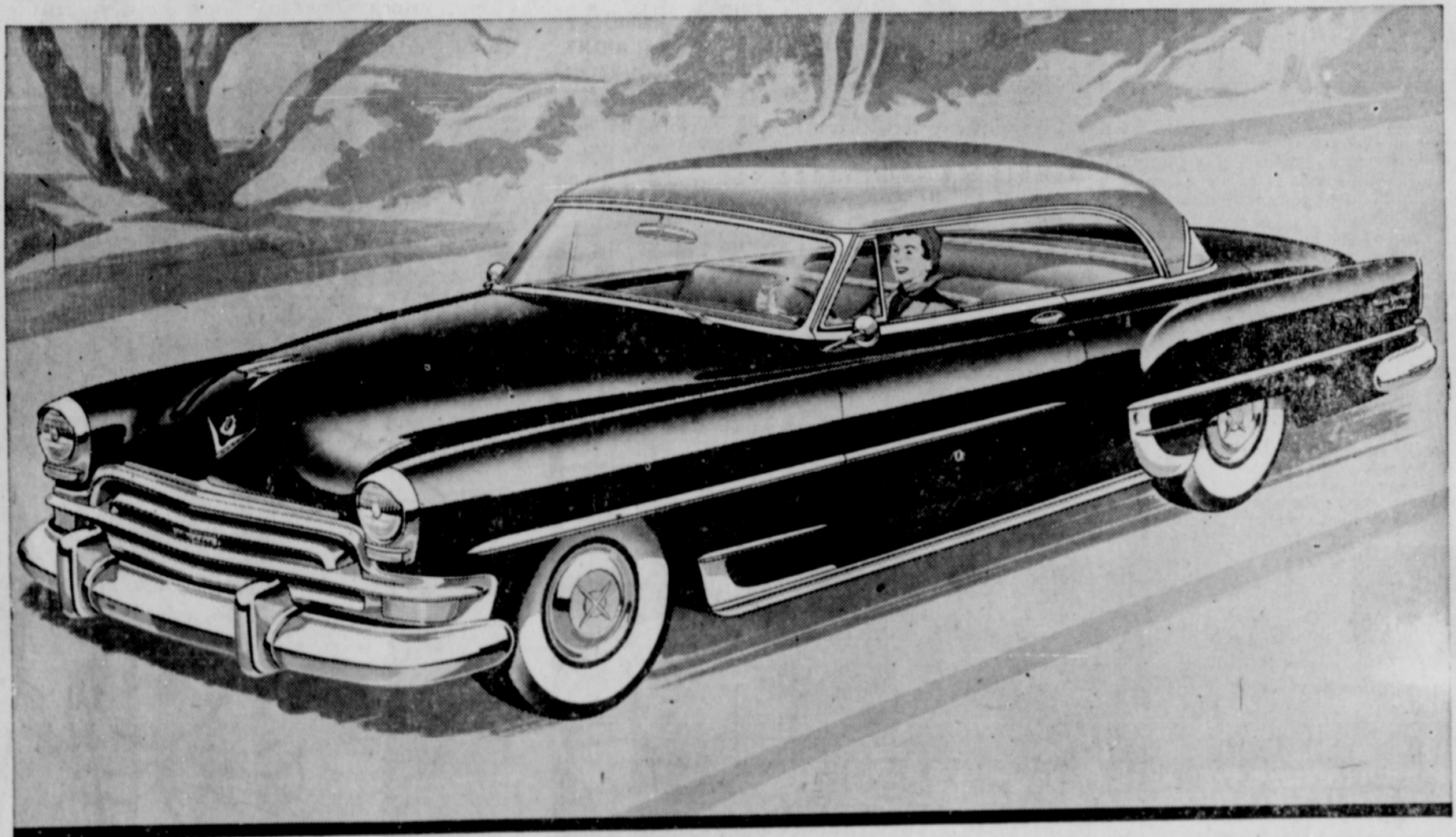

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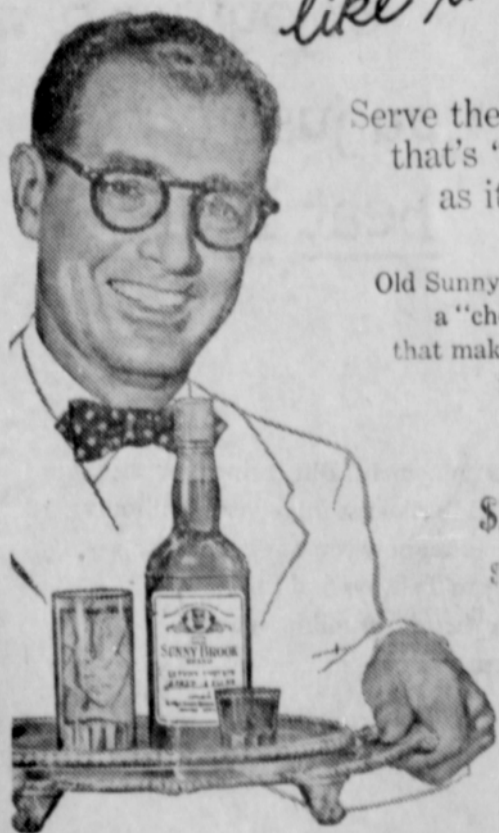
