

Incoming Cattle Must Be Tested

Livestock auction yards in the mid-Columbia area have been requested not to bill cattle into Sherman county until officially tested for Brucellosis or Bang's disease, reports T. W. Thompson, county agent. The Sherman County Cattlemen's association executive committee meeting last week gave consideration to movement of untested cattle into Sherman county and has asked cooperation of surrounding auction yards through the Department of Agriculture, Salem.

The Sherman County Cattlemen's association was requested to sponsor a junior rodeo in May by Gordon Helyer, representative of Moro high school agriculture class. Action on this was deferred until April 8 at which time the association has requested the fair board, Sonny Bain, and representatives of high school agriculture class to meet with them. Mr. Bain has offered to furnish horses and a number of schools in the mid-Columbia area have agreed to furnish contestants, Helyer stated.

The association agreed to request reconsideration of the T.B. and Bang's division federal budget for indemnity payment. Word received by the association has been that federal appropriations for indemnity payments of infected T. B. and Bang's will be in stopped July 1. The association writing the Oregon congressional delegation has requested reconsideration and continuation of indemnity payments to match county and state funds. Present

indemnity payments are \$9 for grade animals by federal and \$8 each from state and county funds. Purebred indemnity payment is somewhat higher.

Membership drive for the association for 1954 was initiated. A contest between the northern and southern executive committee members in securing memberships was voted. All old and prospective members will be mailed a letter requesting dues for the year. Dues for 1954 may be paid to executive committee members or mailed to the county agent's office. Dues are \$2 plus 5 cents a head for grown stock.

Arrangements were made to meet with Dr. Beagel, head, division of animal industry, Portland and Dr. L. L. Taylor in early May, states Thompson. The purpose of this get together will be to plan a coordinated operation program for the Bang's testing work.

BICYCLE RIDERS MUST OBEY REGULATIONS

Bicycle accidents in Oregon tallied 571 in Oregon last year, bringing death to four riders and injuring 312 others, the safety division reported today.

This is an increase of 65 over the 506 bicycle mishaps reported in 1952 when 291 riders were injured and four were killed. The safety office reminded that Oregon law requires bike riders to follow the same rules of the road that apply to motor vehicles, a fact that was overlooked by many parents and youngsters. Bicyclists, especially youngsters, were urged to memorize the following safety rules.

1. Keep to the far right.
2. When with friends, ride in single file.
3. Put books and packages in a carrier and never carry passengers.
4. Obey all signs, signals, and pertinent traffic laws.
5. If you must ride at night, have a good light and rear reflector.
6. Keep bicycles in good condition.

Game Commission Releasing Trout

Oregon State Game commission crews have started the annual fish liberation activities. At present, six trucks are in operation, and shortly three more will be added to the rolling stock.

Thus far, approximately 300,000 fish have been released. Plantings have included silver salmon, steelhead, and chinook salmon which have been planted in the coastal streams and all of which have been marked for future identification.

The crews are now releasing yearling trout in coastal lakes, and beginning next week, trout will be released into the streams of the area. Also next week, trucks from the new Leaburg hatchery on the McKenzie river will start hauling to Willamette valley reservoirs, and the Oak Springs hatchery near Maupin will start sending fish to various part of eastern Oregon. In addition to these liberations of legal-sized fish, kokanee fry will soon be stocked in several lakes, and

some stocking of fingerling-sized rainbow and cutthroat trout will be carried out in coastal waters.

Reino Koski, liberation biologist for the game commission, listed the following tentative schedule of releases of catchable-sized fish to be carried on during the coming year:

March	50,000 trout
April	600,000 trout
May	600,000 trout

June 550,000 trout
July & August 500,000 trout

Through the marking of many of these fish, the commission is attempting to gather information as to their whereabouts after release. Any sportsman catching marked fish can aid the commission in this work by sending in a report containing full details regarding the catch.
