

Storage Space Plans Available

Farmers and others in Oregon who are anticipating big supplies of grain this fall can borrow a large part of the cost of additional storage space and drying equipment, says Ray Teal, seed and grain marketing specialist at Oregon State college.

Teal, citing loan programs of the U. S. department of agriculture, explains any farm owner-operator, tenant, land lord or producer partnership is eligible to participate. Applications for loans may be made at county agricultural stabilization and conservation offices.

Loans may be made either directly through the county office or a local bank and can be on storage for wheat, oats, barley and dry edible beans.

Farmers in Oregon can borrow up to 80 per cent of the cost of new storage bins, cribs or other approved storage structure, the specialist says. However, the structure must meet requirements for storage under the price support program.

Four years may be used to pay loans off. The first installment is payable 12 months after the loan is made. Interest rate is 4 percent per year.

Up to 75 percent of the delivered and assembled cost—exclusive of labor costs—of storage equipment needed to keep stored grain in proper condition may be borrowed under the program. This includes mobile mechanical dryers, air circulators, ventilators, tunnels and fans, Teal states.

Storage equipment loans are payable in three annual install-

ments. As in the case of storage structure loans, the first installment is payable 12 months after the loan is made. Interest rate is 4 percent per year.

There are also special income tax features in the program. Teal adds. They are that cost of new farm or commercial storage facilities can be amortized over a period of five years.

For information concerning types and sizes of storage and equipment best suited for a farmer's particular situation, the specialist suggests checking with county extension agents.

Gardeners May Compete for Prizes

As spring gardens are being planted, T. W. Thompson, extension agent, reminds Sherman county boys and girls they may enroll in 4-H horticultural projects and be eligible for county, state and national awards.

Besides ribbons and premiums from fairs, they may win awards in two divisions—gardening and beautification of home grounds. In the county, up to four gold-filled medals of honor may be given in each division.

The state winner for gardening receives a free trip to the National 4-H Club Congress, which will be in Chicago November 28 to December 2. In home beautification, the state winner receives a 19-jewel wrist watch.

Eight national winners are picked for gardening, and they each receive a \$300 college scholarship. The eight national awards for home beautification are trips to

the National 4-H Club Congress. Last year the Oregon garden winner was Harris Hansen of Tigard and the home beautification winner Donna Pierson of Hood River receiving a national award of a congress trip.

In the garden project, boys and girls learn not only how to plan and care for a garden but to control insects and diseases and to market garden produce economically. The program is also intended to increase family incomes by reducing the amount of food bought and to contribute to better family health by producing enough healthful vegetables and fruits for use throughout the year. Older club members raise vegetables, fruits, nuts, flowers and nursery stock for sale.

Through the beautification of home grounds program, young people learn to plant and care for grasses, flowers, shrubs and trees both for beauty and to control soil erosion. It is intended to make home surroundings more attractive, to give space for family recreation and outdoor living, and to develop a feeling of pride in rural homes. Developing

happy family relationships is another aim of the program.

Unemployment Costs Coming Down

About 34,875 Oregon employers will share reductions of around \$18 millions in unemployment taxes again in 1954 although the average rate is rising slightly and covered payrolls are lower than last year, according to just completed tabulations of the state unemployment compensation commission.

Since the experience rating system went into effect 13 years ago, savings have amounted to over \$100 millions. In the same period about \$125 millions have been paid to unemployed workers, while \$62 millions remains in reserve.

Average tax rate hit a low of 1.13 per cent last year but is expected to reach 1.17 on 1954 payrolls. The rate has been declining

almost steadily from the normal 4.784, 2.7 per cent since 1941.

Qualifying for the lowest rate group of 0.3 per cent were 4,983 concerns with estimated payrolls of \$275 millions, nearly a third of all liable for unemployment taxes. Last year 5,092 firms were in this group, and the year before

The number of employers in other rate groups were listed as follows: 0.6 per cent—1,450; 0.9 per cent—1,346; 1.2 per cent—922; 1.5 per cent—719; 1.8 per cent—456; 2.1 per cent—371; 2.4 per cent—428.
