Mrs. Crowley who has been teaching at Grass Valley for several years is to be married soon and move to Silverton.

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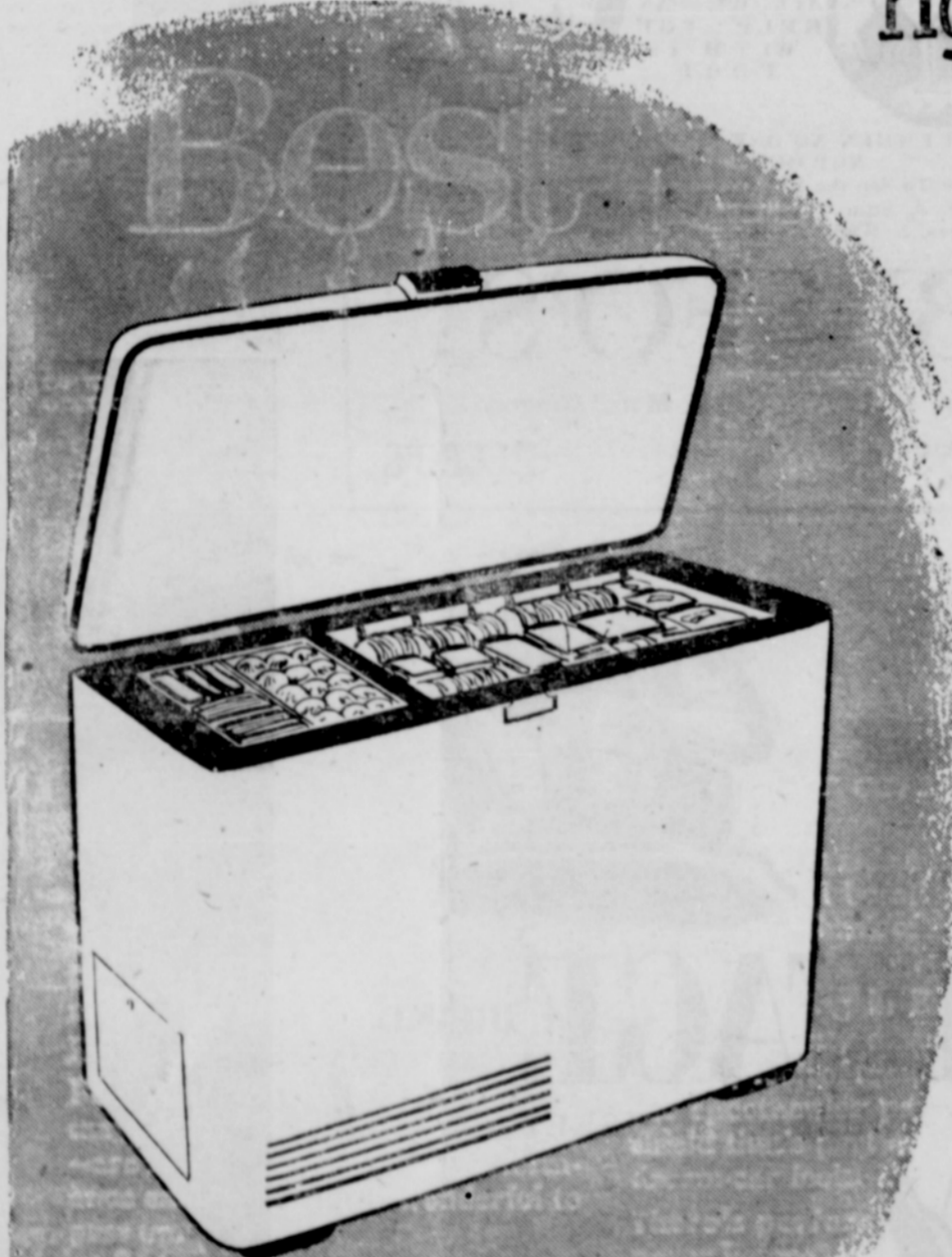
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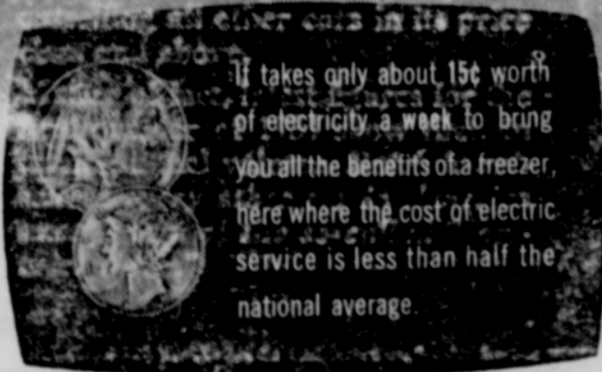
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
