ed with their daughter Linda and Bonnie Tatum to Suttle lake Sunday. The girls remained at the lake for a weeks camping at the 4-H summer camp.



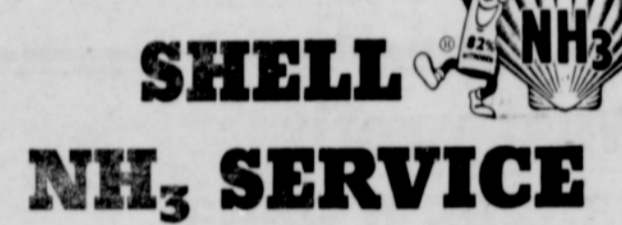

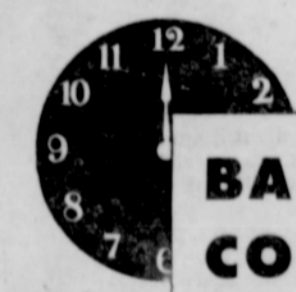
