'Make It Yourself With' Wool Week' Observance Proclaimed by Governor

SALEM—Marking the essential role wool plays in the economies of Oregon and other western states, Governor Paul Patterson has joined 14 other governors in proclaiming the week of September 4-10 as "Make It Yourself with Wool Week."

In making the proclamation Governor Patterson cited the importance of the wool growing industry in Oregon and the nation, pointing out that "because of the great need for wool in clothing for men of our Armed Forces, wool has become one of our essential strategic commodities."

The Governor urged widespread participation in the "Wool Week" observance. "Make It Yourself with Wool Week" is designed to stimulate interest in the "Make It Yourself with Wool" home sewing contest among all young Oregon women eligible to enter the contest," the Governor said.

The competition is sponsored each year by the nation's wool growers to encourage the development of sewing skills among the nation's future home makers and increase interest in sewing with wool. Conducted in Oregon by the Women's Auxiliary of the Oregon Wool Growers Association, the National Wool Growers Auxiliary and the Wool Bureau, the contest is open to all girls between the ages of 14 and 22.

This year more than \$35,000 in prizes—including travel, scholarships, U. S. Savings Bonds and other awards—is offered in the contest, which reaches its climax when state champions from all contest states meet in the National Finals in January. Travel expenses

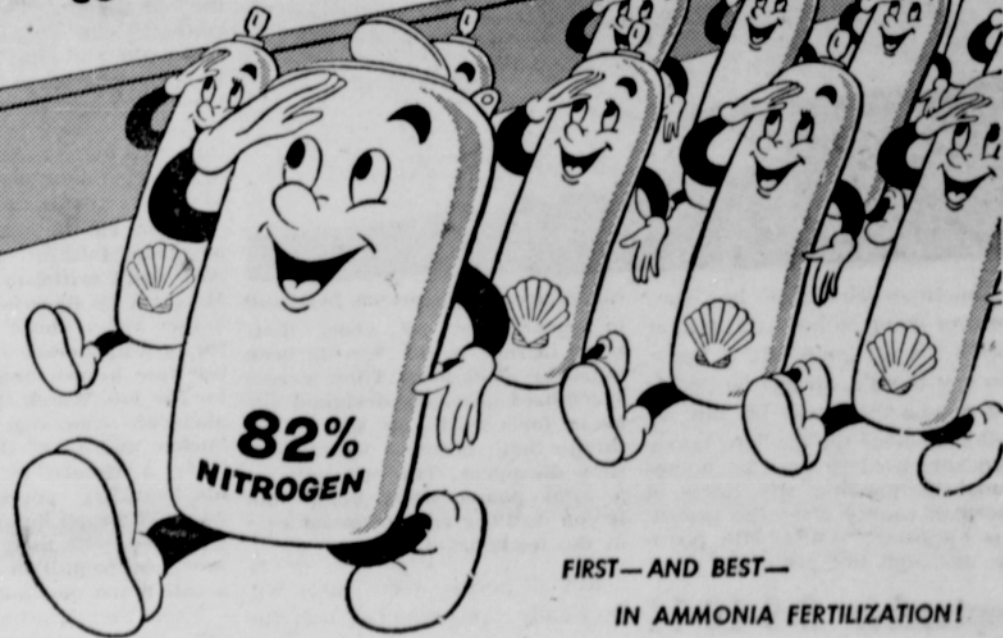
