Mrs. Glenn Dorrell and daughter, Joan, of Portland visited last week with her daughter, Mrs. Pat Buckley.

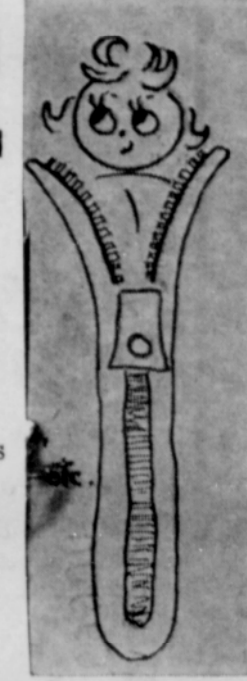
