FARM PLANS

The illness of President Eisenhower is bringing politics to the forefront in a way that will not aid the settlement of the farm program.

With his further candidacy in doubt the two parties appear to be in for a much closer race in 1956 than seemed probable with Ike the Republican candidate. With that prospect leaders of both sides have jumped on the farm problem as a way to pick up some votes.

We are of the opinion that no satisfactory settlement of the farmers' problems can ever be obtained through politics. The presence of government in farm business has brought a great deal of ready cash to the farmer's pocket and has put him in a poor position otherwise. In fact government interference has helped but a few farmers financially.

Government meddling has lost markets because government can not sell wheat and cotton and corn overseas without foreign opposition whereas private firms could sell where they could; government aid has broken up and destroyed the fine sales force that had been built up through years of foreign selling; government's hand in the farm business has made farmers dependent on it for methods of production and has reduced the once fine independence of agriculture.

The program adopted by Secretary Benson has made the dairy industry more prosperous than it was. He told it to get out and sell its products and it did, raising the price and reducing the amount in the government's hands.

Best off of any group of agriculture has been the beef raisers who have never asked for nor accepted government supports.

If a close political campaign should bring back the uneconomic 90 per cent rigid supports of wheat prices together with drastic reduction of wheat acreages it will mean the end of wheat growing to this area as an exclusive practice. With 40 per cent of the land out of wheat the big wheat grower cannot compete with 15 acre irrigated farmers. That will mean something else other than wheat on our farms.

We cannot compete on an acreage basis; our survival depends on competition on a price basis which is denied us under rigid supports. We can produce wheat cheaper (or that has always been our boast) and we must do it to regain our market.

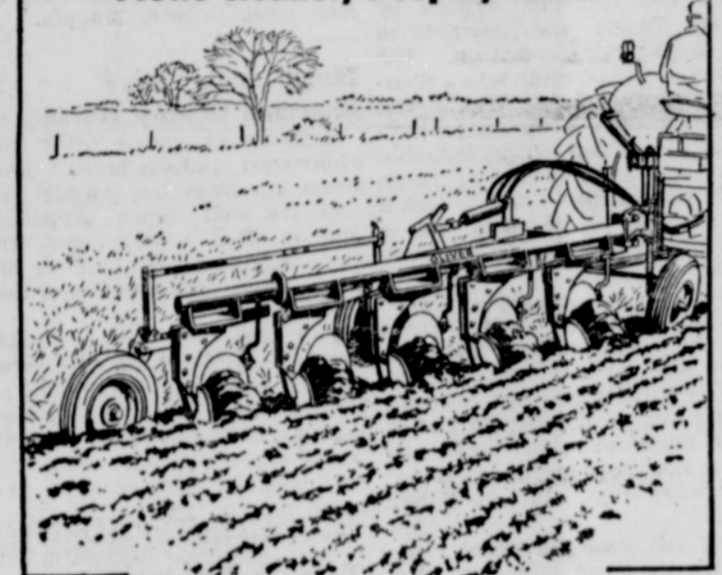

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned until 8 o'clock P. M., Standard Oregon Time, on the 9th day of November, 1955, and immediately thereafter will be publicly opened by the District School Board of

Union High School District No. 1, Sherman County, Oregon, for the purchase at not less than par and accrued interest, of the following described negotiable general-obligation coupon bonds of said school district, in the principal amount of Three Hundred One Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$301,000.00) dated January 1, 1956, in denominations of \$1,000.00 each, numbered one (1) to three hundred one (301), inclusive, to mature serially in numerical order at the rate of \$26,000.00 on the first day of January, 1957 and \$25,000.00 on the first day of January of each of the years 1958 to 1968 inclusive.

The bonds will bear interest payable semiannually at such rate or rates, in multiples of ¼th of 1%, not exceeding six (6) per cent per annum, as shall be specified by the successful bidder. Both the principal of and the interest upon the bonds will be paid at the office of the county treasurer of Sherman County, Oregon.

The bonds will be sold to the highest bidder, but the district school board reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Unless all bids are rejected, the bonds will be awarded to the bidder complying with the terms of the notice of sale, and submitting the bid which provides the lowest cost to the school district.

Each bid must be unconditional, must be accompanied by a certified check or cashier's check in favor of the district, or upon a bank doing business in the state of Oregon, in the sum of \$6,020.00, and must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the undersigned and marked on the outside "Proposal for Bonds". No interest will be allowed on the deposit with the bid, but the check of the successful bidder will be retained against any loss resulting from failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of his bid.

Each bidder shall include in his bid a statement of the total cost to the district, if his bid be accepted.

The successful bidder will be furnished with the written opinion of Winfree, McCulloch, Shuler & Sayers of Portland, Oregon, to the effect that the bonds constitute the valid and legally binding obligations of the said school district.

The bonds will be delivered complete, without undue delay, at the expense of the school district, at such city in Oregon as the successful bidder shall name.
