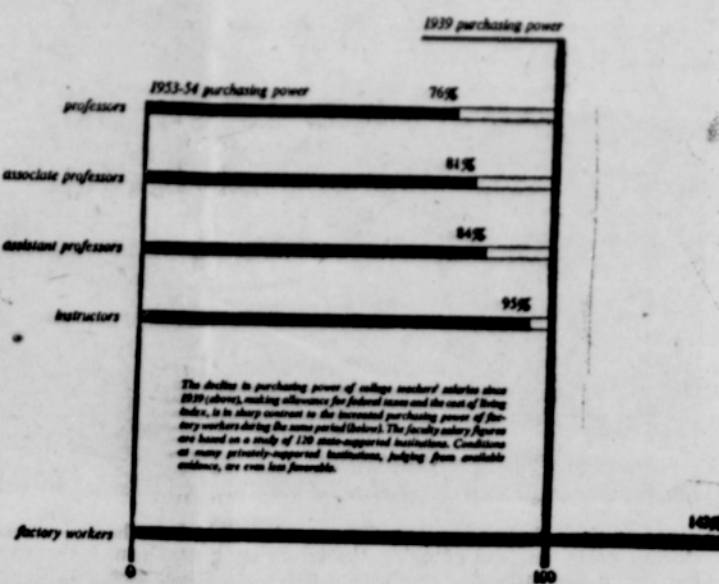

Teachers Want Pay Boost From State

Establishment of a statewide minimum salary schedule was called for in a motion approved by the Economic Welfare committee of the Oregon Education association at a Saturday (December 10) meeting of the group at the association's headquarters building in Portland.

The recommendation of the group is to be acted upon by the association's representative council in March, and if approved by the policy making body, will be submitted to the 1957 Oregon State Legislature for enactment.
