AMBULANCE FUND

The county court has a problem. And it is a problem that will eventually have to be settled by the people. That is the reason the court would welcome some advice from the people.

It is like this. The county budgeted \$1000 for an ambulance last year; the Elks lodge agreed to give \$1800. The value of the present ambulance is between \$600 and \$800 if sold.

The cost of a new ambulance will be about \$5500, properly equipped. That leaves a difference of \$2000 or more that must be raised if a new ambulance is to be purchased.

The citizens of Sherman county have heretofore been very generous in contributing toward purchase of an ambulance and probably would be again if asked. Would they prefer to put it on the tax bill or donate it?

If an ambulance is bought should the county charge for its use? If so, how? By the mile, by the trip. How much for strangers who regularly wreck their cars and themselves on our highways?

This newspaper is inclined to putting the cost in the budget although that might mean a delay in the purchase; favors a per mile charge for use, and thinks that injured visitors would be glad to have an ambulance available at regular rates. But we won't quarrel with those who think differently.

**Livestock Feeding
Topic of Meeting**

Livestock feeds, feeding and management will be discussed during a two-meeting short course, 8 p. m. Tuesday, Feb. 14 and 1:30 p. m., Wednesday Feb. 15, county courthouse, Moro, County Agent Thompson reports.

Jim Oldfield, nutrition expert with the animal husbandry dept and John Landers, livestock extension specialist, OSC, will present current and basic information on livestock feeding and management. The feeding season is drawing to a close, but information being presented will have local adaptation for this or next year.

Two meetings have been planned to allow a more complete presentation of material. Different information will be presented at each meeting and all participating are asked to come for both get-togethers.

Feeding of local feedstuffs include chaff, grain hay, alfalfa and grains and proper supplements to balance the ration to provide proper feed levels will be discussed. Analysis of some local feeds have been made, and this information will be tied into ration discussions. Information and place of protein, urea, stebstrol, minerals and other feedstuffs will be presented as it applied to the local situation. Management practices for wintering and feeding for slaughter will be included.

Farmers with particular feeding problems may have individual conferences with one of these

folks Wednesday morning, Feb. 15. We hope folks will take advantage of these meetings and possible individual conferences.

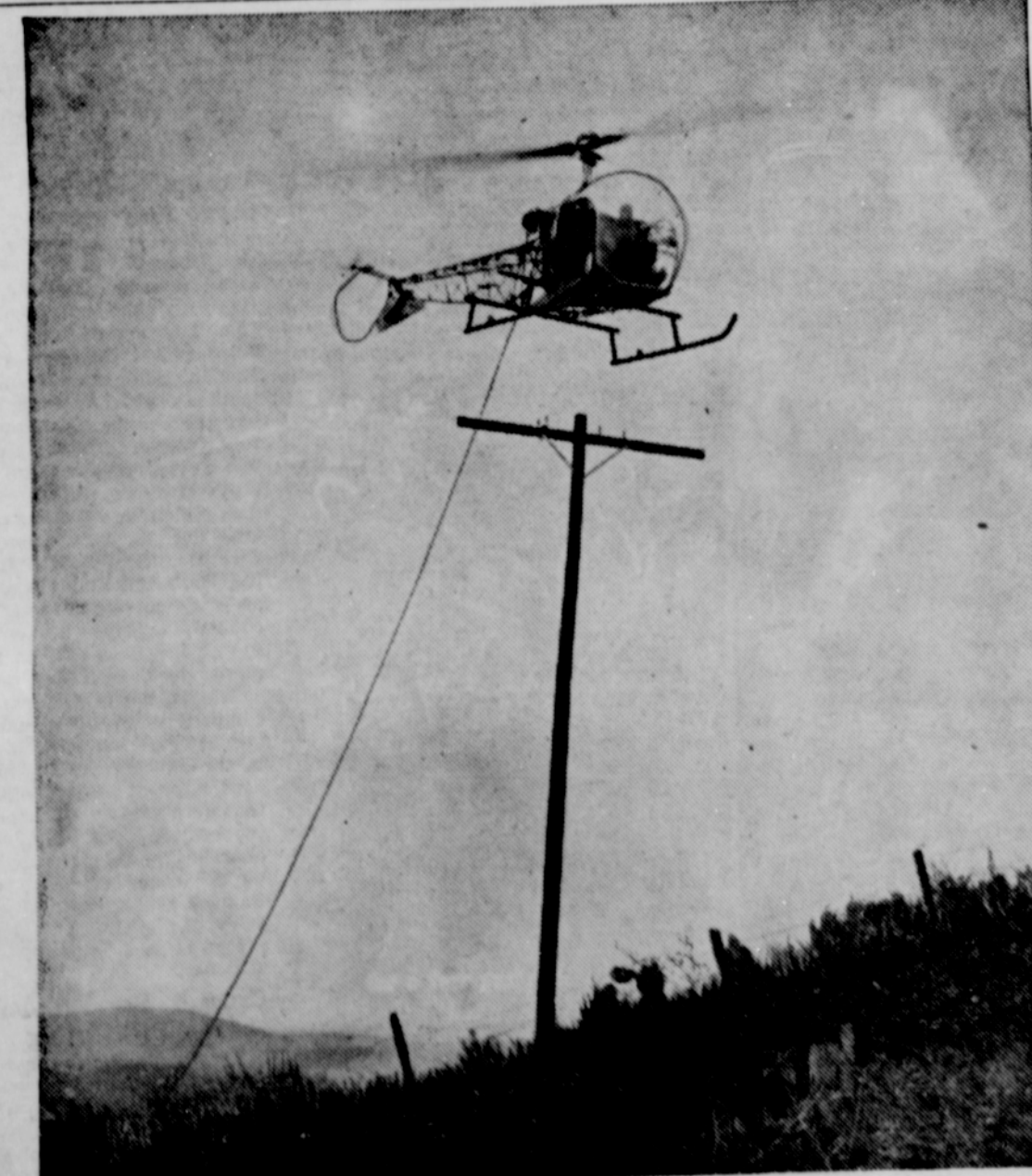

"Whirlybird" helps string a telephone line. More and more uses are being found for helicopters in the telephone business. Not long ago, one was used to help a telephone crew string over two miles of wire across several steep canyons loaded with brush and poison oak. After poles were put up on the hill tops, the 'copter laid a rope across the poles' cross-arms. Then the wire was fastened to the rope and the crew pulled it into position from pole to pole.
