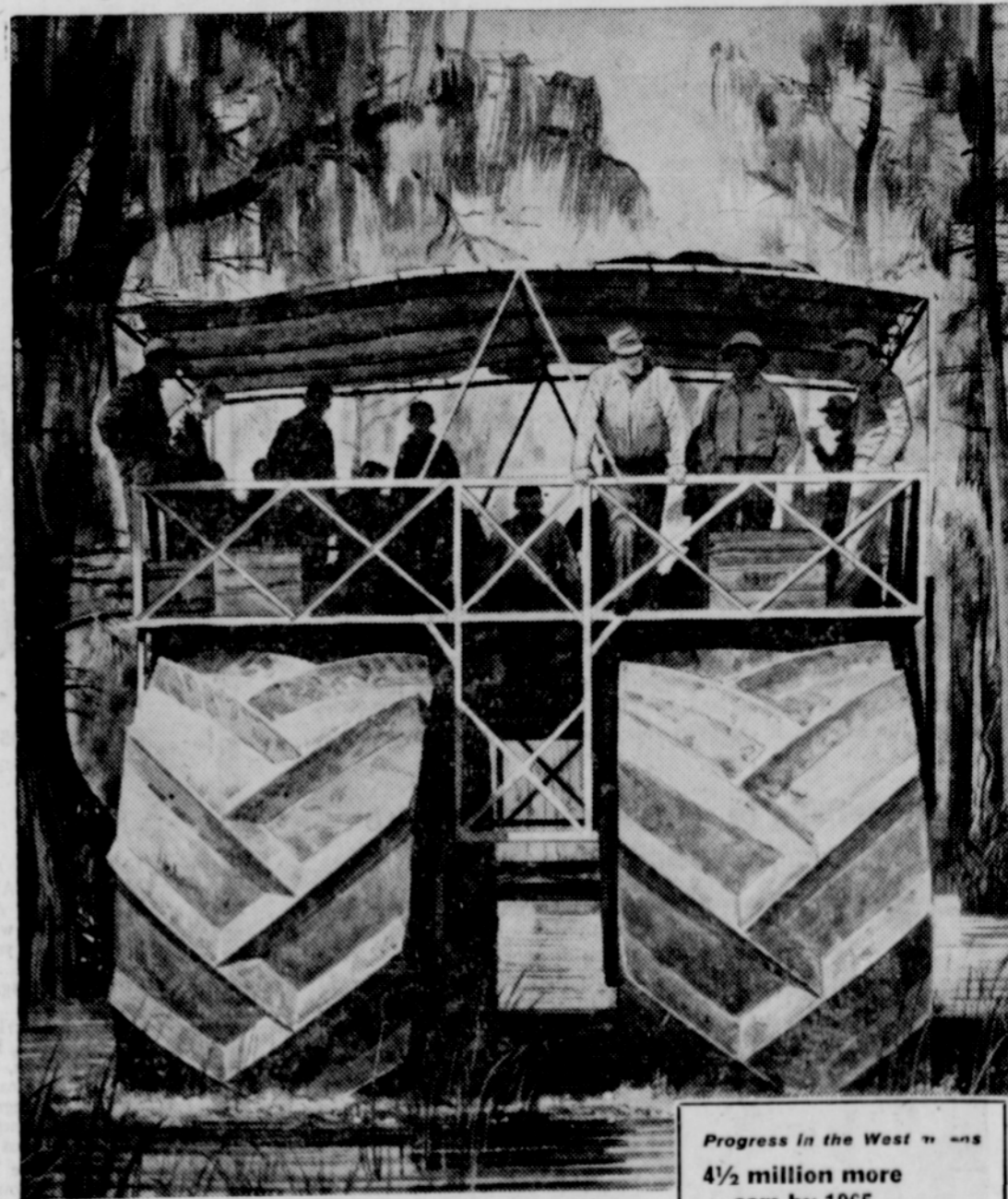

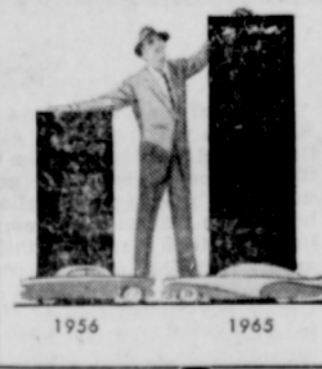


"Swamp buggy" carrying oil geologists into a Louisiana wilderness
