Farm Tour Arranged For Visit To Grass Lands

A farm tour will be held Monday afternoon, June 11, starting at 1:15 p. m., at the L. P. Haven ranch two miles south of Wasco, T. W. Thompson, county agent reports. All are welcome to inspect things county farmers are doing and trial plots established.

A special demonstration of a combination sweep type plow and rod weeder will be shown on the L. P. Haven ranch. Stubble that has not been worked this spring will be used for the demonstration. This ground will be plowed in this manner, left rough over winter, fertilized and seeded to barley next spring.
