

Mrs. Lester Wilson Aiding 4-H Club Bldg

Improved facilities for 4-H and FFA members exhibiting at the Oregon State Fair are being considered by the volunteer leaders of these groups, according to Bill Matzen, John Day rancher, chairman of a state-wide committee named to study the possibilities for these improvements. A state-wide committee of 4-H club leaders was named by Allen Guerber, Benton county, president of the Oregon 4-H Leaders' Association. The vocational agriculture program also named representative citizen advisers in the FFA program throughout the state.

Mrs. Lester Wilson, Sherman county, is a member of the committee.

In discussing the need for the improved facilities for the 4-H and FFA members, Matzen pointed out that existing facilities were not adequate to handle the increased number of exhibits from these youth programs which have expanded a great deal during the last several years. The facilities are being studied for improvement are the 4-H club dormitory which was built in the mid-1920s. It cannot handle properly the large number of 4-H members attending the State Fair. The FFA boys have never had housing facilities. Leaders of both youth organizations have agreed that members of these groups

should be housed and fed together in a cooperative program of operation.

Non-livestock exhibit facilities for the 4-H and FFA programs likewise have been over-crowded for several years. Plans are being studied whereby 4-H exhibit space can be provided in one building along with an improved dormitory. This would release exhibit space in the existing junior exhibits building for FFA farm machinery and other exhibits. Livestock exhibits for both groups would continue in the present livestock barns.

Summer Driving Also Dangerous

Drivers were warned today to beware of "summer ice" on Oregon highways.

"Summer ice", traffic safety officials explained, is caused when rain mixes with accumulated oil and dirt after a hot day, causing the highway to become extremely slippery.

Danger is heightened because the road does not look hazardous and a driver may hit his brakes only to find his car slipping and sliding all over the road.

The hazard can be lessened if drivers will slow their speed as soon as a summer shower begins. Leaving plenty of space between cars would also reduce the possibility of rear-end collisions if a sudden stop is necessary, safety officials suggested.

Former Leaders Eligible For Awards

Former Oregon 4-H club members who are now leaders in their communities are eligible for recognition awards including a trip this fall to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago, reports Burton Hutton, state 4-H leader at OSC.

The National 4-H Alumni Recognition program designed to recognize outstanding adults who were former 4-H club members, Hutton says. Two deserving adults in each county will be awarded certificates. Four state winners will be presented copper plaques and their names entered into national competition. Four men and four women in the U. S. will be eventually awarded trips, the 4-H leader explains.

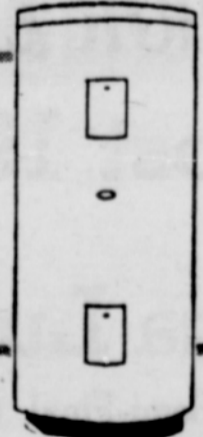
