home while they took a little vacation. Richard Tallman of Gresham is here spending a few days visiting his aunt, Mrs. Boyce Baylock and family.

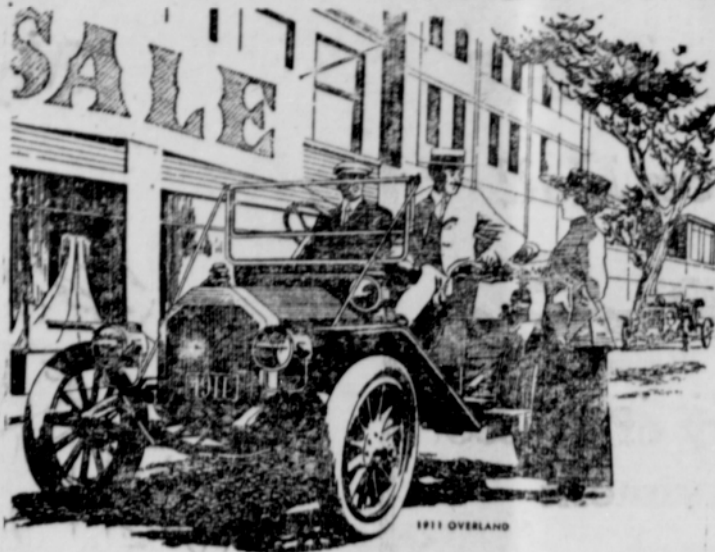
