LEGISLATIVE LOYALTIES

A quick impression of this legislature, especially the house, is that it seems immature. This doesn't apply to the members. It is the proceedings that seem in the hands of politically untripped.

This session more than any in recent times there is great effort toward strategy. The Democrats have strategy and the Republicans have strategy. Or that is what they call it. Both sides are trying to put the other in the hole. It is entirely possible that the whole effect will be to put the taxpayer in the hole.

If there was maturity in the leadership it would be able to discern that the best strategy would be to pass a few actually needed laws, make a few needed appropriations and go home. However, legislators are being prevailed upon to vote against the welfare of their constituents and for party strategy.

There is no question but there is a strong demand for tax reduction in both the state and federal affairs. Yet, the state tax will probably be fifty million or more than 20 percent above that of the last biennium. There is no question but the people want assurance that there be no state property tax. Yet, many representatives from farm areas are helping prevent its passage. That is not good strategy. Nor is it good government.

BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Governor Holmes has said that he wants to get rid of some of the

state's numerous boards and commissions although it must be said that his vote helped create many of them. A legislator was quoted the other day as saying that Oregon had 101 boards and that is was a greater number than other states had empowered.

We are not entirely unsympathetic with the governor's desires. There must be some boards that can be done away with. We do object to the broad-ax approach. In fact, there is a proposal to name an interim committee to study boards and commissions to determine which ones to behead. Unless men acquainted with government and with a mature philosophy are on the committee its opinions may be of no more value than that of legislators.

If the aim is to get rid of boards and give the governor more power it is wrong. If the aim is to weed out boards and consolidate them into better operating groups it might help.

There are several agricultural commissions: to handle dairy, potato, wheat, seed and other commodities and it is desired that these be under the department of agriculture. That we think would be a poor move.

The board of control handles institutions and has a good record of performance. The governor ought not to be solely responsible for the penitentiary, the hospitals, etc. It is too much work for him and many governors are not much interested in them although handling them is a source of political gain. A board of three has worked well.

PICKLES AND BEER

Last Sunday, although the west wind was blowing up the Columbia and the immature sun was unable to warm the air, many persons were having a picnic. The urge to eat outside is a strong one for western Americans it seems.

What it is that prevails on a woman to put a meal together, pack it carefully and drive thirty miles to eat it cold is something not entirely clear to those who prefer warm food on a table.

It may be that longing for the ordinary picnic fare was the cause of so much outside eating Sunday. Some folks may long for a meal of salami sandwiches, pickles and beer as ardently as grandmother watched the dock grow large enough for a mess of greens. In any event spring has already begun.

Last Friday night members of the Legislature and their wives journeyed to Corvallis for dinner and the basketball game as guests of the college and the Corvallis Chamber of Commerce. Before the game started we were greeted with a yell from the Oregon State cheering section as follows: "Welcome Legislature. We want Money!"

No response was anticipated, but the students were directing their plea to a sensitive group. Under the direction of Senator Tony Yurri, Ontario, we came back with, "We, We, We do too, We Want Money, Too!"

Sunday afternoon we were taken on a sternwheeler cruise of the Portland waterfront area. Our hosts this time were members of the Port of Portland Commission. A highlight of the trip was a beautiful exhibition of two of the

Portland fireboats before the trip began.

But all good things must end, and Monday morning we were back in the old law-mill. Present for his first day was Stafford Hansell, who replaces the late Irvin Mann. None of us envy the task he and his charming wife have ahead of them. Learning the ropes and attempting to become acquainted with somewhere around 1900 bills, resolutions, etc., all at once is a staggering proposition.

Tuesday morning HJR 20, calling for an interim committee to make a study of boards and commissions, came up for third reading. This was the one I mentioned a couple of weeks back which many fear is the opening wedge toward abolishment of commodity commissions.

The debate following took on strong political overtones. Many felt that since Governor Holmes has announced his intention of eliminating many boards and commissions, and since appointments to the interim committee will be made entirely by Democrats, the resulting committee cannot help but be a biased group. Objections were also raised to the wording of the resolution.

After an attempt to refer the bill to State and Federal Affairs failed twenty to thirty-three, it was passed with thirty-six in favor of it, seventeen opposed.

On Wednesday HJM 2, memorializing Congress for immediate construction of Hell's Canyon Dam, died a long and wordy death in the Senate. The argument lasted all morning and part of the afternoon session and resulted in a tie vote, which automatically killed it. A motion then made to refer it was ruled out of order. Memorials seldom receive so much attention.

No visitors from home this week, but I received some family data from another secretary which should be of interest to many of you in Sherman and Wasco counties. It was told to me by Bernice Slater, secretary to Rep. John Goss.

Her father, Cornelius Jackson Bright, moved from Iowa to The Dalles in 1883, where he taught school, worked on farms and attended the Wasco Independent Academy. After graduation he studied law in the office of Watkins and Bird.

In 1888 he moved to Wasco (then still in Wasco County) where he taught school for two terms. In partnership with A. B. McMillan, he began publication of the first newspaper in what is now Sherman County, The Wasco Observer.

After division of the counties he became the first Superintendent

of Schools in Sherman County, after disposing of his interest in the paper. After being admitted to the bar in 1890 he opened a law office in Wasco.

During this period he served as clerk of the school board, and as such he drove his horse and buggy one day to Rufus to meet the new school teacher, Mildred Larson. Romance followed, and they were married in 1896. From 1909 until Mr. Bright's death in 1920 he maintained law offices in Moro and The Dalles in partnership with W. C. Bryant of Moro. It would be interesting to know how many people in the area might still remember Mr. and Mrs. Bright. "Drop me a card."
