Mr. and Mrs. Donald Clodfelter were business visitors in Portland Wednesday and Thursday.

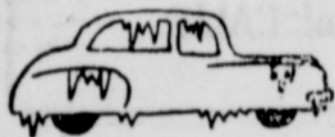

Mr. and Mrs. Olan Stark were business visitors in Portland last week end.

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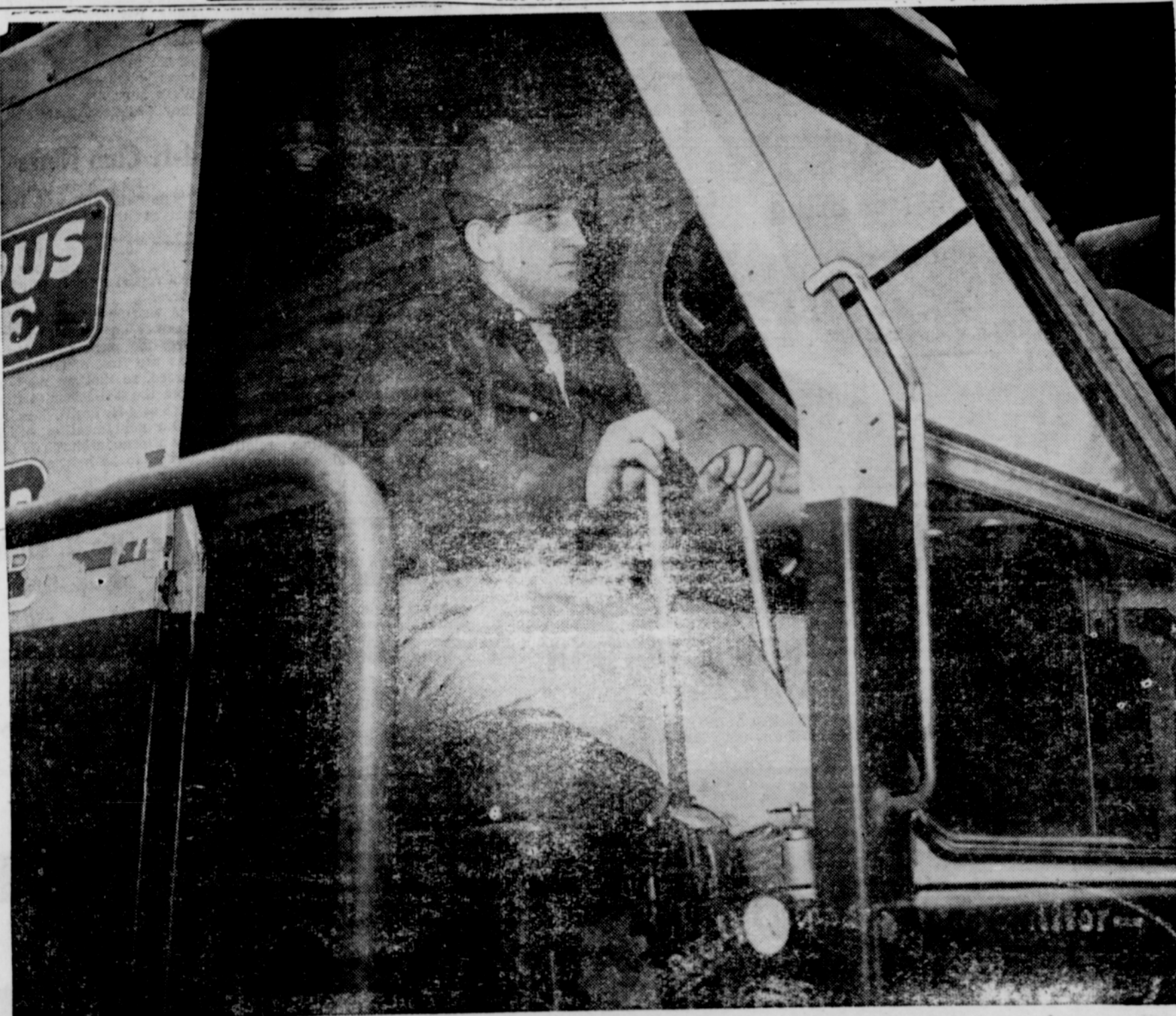
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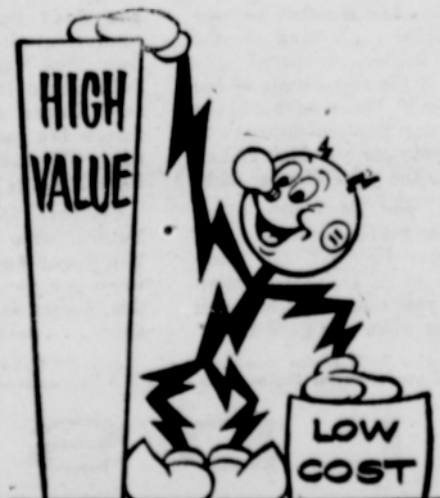
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
